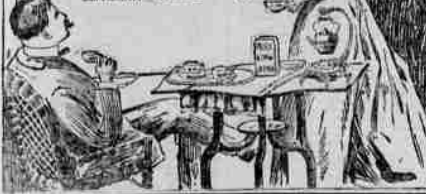

NEWS OF THE WEST.

**Caught By a Mass of Rock and
Crushed to Death.**

WOMAN KILLED BY A RUNAWAY.

**Did Under Chloroform—A Fatal Blow
Chinaman Nudged—San Francisco's Hike.**

Frank C. Winer, a bookkeeper at Stockton, Cal., died Friday morning while being chloroformed at a surgical operation. He was suffering from a cancer on the side of his tongue and the operation could not be delayed. The physicians feared a collapse.

This evening Mrs. V. E. Walker was in a wagon coming to Santa Cruz, Cal., her horse became frightened and fell away, causing her to be thrown out. Her arm was fractured and she sustained internal injuries from which she died before she could be taken home.

Duo Yeh, a Chinaman, was found dead in bed Friday morning at Visalia, California, with his head nearly severed from his body. The coroner's jury rendered a verdict that the deceased's death was caused by his throat being cut by unknown parties. There is no clue to the murderer.

The records of the San Francisco, California, health office show that during the year ending June 30th, there were 5,359 births reported, of which 2,416 were males, 2,943 were females. The race and nationality were Caucasian 5,007, Ethiopian 6, Mongolian 56.

A young man named Frank Charles died Friday afternoon at a Sacramento, Cal., hospital, from the effects of a blow upon the head received about four weeks ago. There is a deep mystery surrounding the case. Charles positively refused to tell who struck him. It has been learned that Charles had some kind of difficulty with a man in front of a saloon.

While three Japanese were on the outskirts of Watsonville, California, at midnight Wednesday an Irish waylaid them, they were met by three Chinese and one was caught with a rope, while the others were frightened away by a yell in the hands of one of the Chinese. The third Jap was then relieved of \$4.50 in money. During the melee he also received a pistol bullet in the right thigh. His wound is considered dangerous.

Evansville, Wyoming, Herald: Lelan Howard, a well known citizen of Albany, attempted suicide on last Sunday morning, by cutting his throat with a razor. He severed the windpipe, but is still living, and by reason of prompt medical attention, his condition is likely to recover. His wife died about a year ago, leaving him the care of a large family of children. He was not able to secure steady employment, and was very despondent. Continued worry and care has driven the poor man insane. He was at one time a member of the Wyoming legislature.

James Douglass, aged 35 years, was instantly killed by having a mass of rock and earth weighing at least 1000 lbs. fall upon him at Pomona, Cal., Friday. He has been superintendent of hydraulic operations in the upper part of San Antonio canyon for some months. The men were blasting away a mass of rock that interfered with operations. When the blast was fired Douglass ran away, but when it was over he quickly returned. At that moment a section of rock and earth about five feet thick started to roll from the cliff above his head. Douglass saw it and started to run, but tripped on a rock and fell. Before he could rise the mass fell upon him. He was instantly crushed and killed. He leaves a widow and children in Oakland.
