CHICAGO TO HAVE CITY TUBERCULOSIS SANITARIUM

Chicago, Anril 7.—The city's approval of a municipal subseculosis sanitarium by a vote of four to one, has been followed by immediate activity in preparations looking towards its establishment. The idea is to have the sanitarium completed by a year from next fall. The first tax levy cannot be made until next year I it is found possible to borrow on the strength of next year's tax the work will be begun almost immediately. According to tentative plans the sanitarium will be located outside the city, probabily at a distance of from 25 to 20 miles.

It is proposed that it be built to accommodate 39 patients.
Statistics show that there are usually between 10,000 and 12,000 victims of tubstroulosis in Chicago. One-fourth of these are in early stages of the disease, and it is on this basis that the estimate of 300 is made of those who would probably seek entrance to the sanitarism. Only those in early or medetately advanced stages of the disease will be accepted as the project was happing and not as a place for those who have reached such an advanced stage that their cases are hopsiess. This latter class will be cared for at the new Cook county inspital to be opened next fall.
