Chicago, April 7.--The city's approval of a municipal tuberculosis sanitarium by a vote of four to one, has been followed by immediate activity in preparations looking towards its establishment.

Statistics show that there are usually between 3,000 and 12,000 victims of tuberculosis in Chicago. One-fourth of these are in early stages of the disease, and it is on this basis that the estimate of 20 is made of those who would probably seek entrance to the sanitarium.

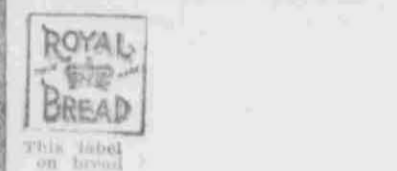
