

LONDON, 6 —It is stated that the Queen of Madagascar has invited all the chiefe of the capital, to decide upon the expediency of an agreement with France.

Belfast, 6.—After a torchlight procession last night in honor of Sir Stafford Northcote, Orangemen smashed the windows of a convent

and two newspaper offices.

Col. King Harnan, M. P. for County Dublin, and Lord Arthur Hill, M. P. for County Down, laid the foundation stone of the new Orange Hotel in this city to-day. The number of Orangemen assembled to witness the terremonies was the largest that t the largest that has congregated for 20 years. During the proceedings the stand collapsed, and several per sons were seriously injured.


