OF LIFE AND LIMB.

A CORRESPONDENT writing from 'Saem, Utah County, suggests two subects upon which the Legislature might act with profit to the community-in relation to estrays; and to prevent the frequency of losses of health and life by accidental lye-polsoning. The NEWS has on several occasions heretofore pointed out the defective and uneven character of the statute in relation to estrays, and it is therefore unnecessary now to endorse the suggestion in that regard of our correspondent.

It some measure could be enacted that would prevent the occurrence of fatal and injurious accidents from accidental lye-poisoning it would be a great boon, because it would prevent much suffering, sorrow and remorse. The number of accidents of this character that have occurred in the Territory in the past has been appalling, and have been perhaps all the more regrettable because they could, in most instances, have been prevented by the exercise of a little necessary caution.
