

abroad a knowledge of these great truths, without fee or hope of earthly reward, should take comfort and encouragement from the fact that not only are a few honest souls here and there, receiving and obeying the gospel, but the effects of their teachings and testimony are perceptible in the whole religious world, stirring it up to unwonted thought and to the discussion of principles that have been unchallenged for centuries; and the result cannot fail to be advantageous to the truth.

"Mormonism" is of necessity a disturbing element in religious society, and there is no wonder that it is opposed by the orthodox and those who preach for hire and divine for money. It will accomplish its work, spread the light of the true Gospel, dissipate the fogs and mists of theological error, overturn the creeds of men, and fill the earth with the knowledge and worship of the true and living God.

STRAIGHT DEMOCRATIC DOCTRINE.

THE supporters of the doctrine of "a tariff for revenue" have strong grounds for their position apart from the wide field of argument against protection by the Government of private industries. It is from the Constitution that the Government derives all its authority. Outside of that instrument Congress has no power of taxation. Where within its articles can be found any warrant for the imposition of taxes for the purpose of protecting any private industry? Judge Jere Black, when interviewed on this question not long ago, declared that "Congress has no more right to levy a tax on imports than it has on land, beyond what is necessary for the support and maintenance of the Government. All beyond that is robbery."

This is very strong language, but it will be found very difficult to controvert. Expediency is one thing, right another. The great constitutional lawyer speaks, by the book, and his utterances on this question are straight Democratic doctrine as well as plain enunciations of principles contained in the supreme law of the land.

But the ultra "free trade" doctrine, which some Democrats insist upon, is impracticable unless it is made the general rule of all commercial countries. Reciprocity between all nations having trade relations is essential to the full maintenance of free trade by any of them. "Incidental protection" is a term which has come into use in the discussion of "a tariff for revenue," and the principle it expresses seems to meet existing requirements exactly. The Republican policy of a protective tariff has for its principal object the protection of private industries, which is not warranted by the Constitution. But the Democratic policy of "a tariff for revenue" is such that while aimed at a strictly lawful object, it can be so arranged as to afford incidental protection to such home industries as need encouragement, without establishing and maintaining monopolies.

Herein lies the distinction between the policies of the two parties on a question that is certain to play a very important part in the approaching political campaign. If the Democrats do not divide in consequence of the adherence of some impracticables among them to the ultra free trade doctrine, they will have a large advantage over their adversaries on the tariff question, except among the great monopolists and those who are interested in the continued support of monopolies at the expense of the great body politic.

YOU ARE HEREBY REQUIRED TO APPEAR in an action brought against you by the above named plaintiff in the Probate Court, of the County of Salt Lake, Territory of Utah, and to answer the complaint filed therein within ten days, (exclusive of the day of service) after the service on you of summons—if served within this County; or, if served out of this County, but in this district, within twenty days; otherwise within forty days, or judgment by default will be taken against you, according to the prayer of said complaint.

The said action is brought to obtain a decree from this court dissolving the marriage contract existing between said plaintiff and you, and awarding to Plaintiff the custody of Leonard Mullett and Louisa Ann Mullett, minors, the issue of said marriage and for such other order and decree as to the Court seemeth proper and for costs of suit. Plaintiff alleges as grounds for this application that defendant has cruelly treated the plaintiff to the extent of causing great bodily injury, and also to the extent of causing great mental distress to plaintiff, and that defendant for more than two years last past has willfully neglected to provide for the plaintiff the common necessities of life.
