

DESTRUCTION.

Streets of Butte Strewn
With Dead Bodies.

TERRIFIC EXPLOSIONS.

Broke the City As If It Is the
Effects of an Earthquake.

WELL-KNOWN UTAH BOY KILLED.

The Latest Details of the Disaster By
Which Nearly a Thousand Persons
Were Killed or Wounded.

The foregoing dispatch was received by Dr. Davidson this morning. A telegram has been sent to Drayton asking for further particulars, and a reply is expected this afternoon. At least it is to be hoped that Dr. Davidson will take this weighty responsibility from the
hands of the committee for the benefit of the wounded in the hospitals.

Alma Bailey Davidson was the boy's name, although he is best known by the name of Bailey Dainger. He was the son of Dr. Alma J. Davidson, of this city, and Leslie Young, sister of Dr. David. He was a promising young man of great personal beauty and was in his twentieth year. After leaving school to study architecture with Mr. Stirling of this city, for several years, he went to Butte about two months ago in search of employment, not having any means of subsistence, nor the
means to obtain them.

It will be decided later what will be done with the body. The news was to be communicated to the young man's mother this afternoon.

SALT LAKE, Jan. 16.—The latest from Butte, received here yesterday, states our soldiers were killed by last night's explosion. The fire department was nearly wiped out and the town extensively damaged. The buildings burned, including the warehouses of the Butte Hardware Company, Pacific D'Amours Drug Company and Drygood, Central Mercantile Co., the old electric light works, the old stable building, flour and feed warehouse. The contents were entirely destroyed. The loss is large but is not yet estimated. The Great Northern freight depot was completely wrecked and six men were buried.

The dead numbered 200, and the injured over 500.

THE FIRE.

SALT LAKE, Jan. 16.—A young Japanese who arrived at the station of Dr. Paulina Ogurzoy yesterday was Dr. Ogurzoy. While the doctor left Butte yesterday, the Mexican from San Francisco just arrived with the news that his master had been murdered.

"The soldiers were going to the capital," said Mr. Ogurzoy, "to take the place of the Frenchmen who had been captured, and to demand their release." "The respect and admiration which I have for my country will not allow me to acknowledge that the respects of the Japanese government are not deserved, and that they are unworthy of the service of the Japanese."

"As it is, twelve of them have been killed, while only one Japanese has been killed."
