NEW YORE, 6.—A Dublin dis-patch says: Great excitament was caused among the members of and sympathisers with the National Land League by the arrest of Thes. Brennan, which took place quietly, soon after seven o'clock in the morning, at his lodgings, No. 7 Ruasell Street. The arrest was for a speech made at Balls on the 22nd uft. It was affected by Supt.
