

A CALIFORNIA GUN.—The Sonora Democrat of November 18th says:

T. J. Cranmer, of Vallejo, Calaveras county, gave a public exhibition of his newly invented gun in this city on Wednesday last. Quite a number of our citizens were present, and all were astonished at this truly wonderful engine of destruction. The model on exhibition is only about thirty inches long, including the barrels, three in number, and yet the rapidity, force and accuracy of its firing almost surpass belief. It is said that the gun can be made to discharge no less than 600 balls per minute. It is so simple, also, that a child could apparently manage it. The whole machine is encased in a small iron box, and looks as if it could be carried under a man's arm. The charges are placed in a sort of hopper, like a coffee mill, divided by a tin partition. On one side is placed the powder and in the other the balls, the hopper containing enough for several rounds. The caps are then placed in a little sliding arrangement at the side of the gun. This being done, all that is required is to turn a small crank, and the battery opens its fire with tremendous force and rapidity. The cylinder of the model exhibited is 6 1/2 inches long, and 9 inches in diameter, and contains 84 chambers, resembling the chambers of Colt's six-shooter. It loads and caps itself, and works with all the ease of a revolver pistol. The charge of powder required is only about one-third as much as what is ordinarily used in other guns.
