**KENTUCKY.**  
A Soldier Killed.  
LOUISVILLE, 25.—This evening, J. D. Dyer, a private soldier at the Taylor barracks in this city, shot through the head and instantly killed L. Williams, another private, who had been too intimate with Dyer's wife. Dyer had been drinking and shot Williams with out warning. The murderer was turned over to the civil authorities and is now in jail.

**CONNECTICUT.**  
Indian Policy.  
HARTFORD, 25.—At a meeting of the American Missionary association today, a report was made endorsing the policy of President Grant. Ex-governor Hawley then made an address, in which he asked why Saxons and Protestants should kill Indians, when Latins and Catholics even got on without it. Secretary Delano then made a long and eloquent address, explaining the new policy adopted by General Grant, who sounded the key note at his inauguration in his message when he said, "I am in favor of any policy in behalf of the Indians that tends to civilize and make them citizens."

**PACIFIC COAST DISPATCHES.**  
Railroad Accident.  
SAN FRANCISCO, 25.—Much excitement was created here this afternoon by the announcement that the east-bound Central Pacific train had broken through the San Joaquin bridge and gone into the river and that many lives were lost. The latest special dispatch says that four cars were smashed, the track torn up for fifty feet, and one passenger, unknown, fatally injured. The families of many less seriously injured. The accident occurred half a mile west of the bridge where there is an embankment of fifteen feet high. Governor Morton and party who were in a special car at the rear of the train were unharmed. The westward train has not yet arrived here and no news of the injured are received.

**FOREIGN NEWS.**  
AUSTRIA.  
Ministerial Changes.  
VIENNA, 25.—The Hohensoffern ministry tendered their resignation today; there is no doubt his majesty will accept them.

**GREAT BRITAIN.**  
Another Great Colliery Disaster.  
LONDON, 25.—Another frightful colliery explosion took place this afternoon at the Seaham mine, near Newcastle. Thirty-three men were in the pit at the time, some of whom have been reached. There is scarcely a hope of saving a single life. The families of the victims, with large numbers of people, have gathered around the mouth of the pit.

**ITALY.**  
Political.  
ROME, 25.—The Workingmen's societies of Rome and Naples refused to participate in the congress of workingmen, holding that the assembly was a republican demonstration unfriendly to Italy. The government has issued orders for the arrest of the participants against the international society and partisans of the Republic.
