TEACHING INSURANCE TO SCHOOL CHILDREN.

German school children are taught he elementary principles of insurance coording to Lee K. Frankel, writing in the December Charitles and The Commons. Even before the child reaches the age where it comes under the in-surance law, it has a general know-ledge of what the law means, of what its rights under the law will be, and for the contributions which it must make for sickness and invalidity insur-ance, and the benefits which will be derived in case of sickness, accident, of invalidity. This knowledge is spread through the means of charts one of which Dr. Frankel describes as follows: "The illustrations on accident insur-ance might be designated "before and after." In the upper left-hand corner we have the injured workman who has lost a leg through an industrial acci-dent, compelled to wander through the streets on his wooden stump, and to earn his livelihood by begging in the guise of an organ grinder. In the up-per right-hand corner we have a slin-liar workman today, under the acci-dent law, with an artificial leg, applymons. Even before the child reaches
