eduction in Price of Coal Due to His

Orders.

The reduction in the wholesale price of coal is due to Mr. Harriman being convinced by Gov. Wells and Col. Holmes that the price of coal here was too high. So, at his order, Supt. D. O. Clark of the Union Pacific Coal com-pany, marked down the wholesale price 30 cents. The dealers explain that they do not make their part of the reduction the same, because it would not make even change.
