## The Spanish Fork and Payson District Moving for an Auxiliary Station.

The Spanish Fork and Payson District Moving for an Auxiliary Station.

The Tonnage of the Utah Sugar Co. Will Reach 96,000—Sixteen and a Half Million Lbs. Made to Date.

Payson, Utah, Nov. 25.—A meeting of the beet growers of Payson was held last night to consider the proposition of the Utah Sugar company to build an auxiliary cutting station in this district including the towns of Spanish Fork, Payson, Lake Shore, Benjamin, Salem, Spring Lake and Santaquin.

The company proposes to build a factory providing the farmers will agree to plant 5,000 acres of beets for a period of five years.

Mr. T. H. Wilson, Jr., was elected chairman and S. D. Moore secretary.

A good representation of beet growers and business men was present and quite an interest manifested.

A committee of 10 was appointed to canvass the farmers to ascertain how many acres can be guaranteed for a factory and it is thought a sufficient amount can be had. The company reserves the right to locate the factory at the most convenient point in the district and the work will be commenced soon if everything is favorable, so that the crop of 1904 can be taken care of.
