

MAKING STATE LAWS

Alison introduces a Bill for the
Australian Ballot System.

SENATE HOLDS A SHORT SESSION.

Issue Considered. H. B. No. 42. By
Baldwin, of Tooele, 24 &
Special order.

The Senate was called promptly to
order at 2 o'clock this afternoon by
President Cannon. The Vice President
of the State's Patriotic Committee
was present. The minutes of business
of yesterday were read and approved
and a communication was received
from the House concerning the
action of House Joint Resolution No.
4, relating to the salary question.
Senate Journal No. 1, transmitting
copies to review the tariff rates of
the McKinley bill.

The State appointed Senator Booth,
Candido, New, Jones, Evans, Horne,
and Shirley to set up the House
committee on taxation. The tariff
measure was referred engrossed and
referred to the proper committee for that
purpose.

Alison introduced a bill for an act
authorizing the executive, defining or
amending the laws now prescribing
punishments of capital offenses. The proposed
law is nothing more nor less than
the Australian ballot system. The bill
was referred to the committee on taxation.

the taking up of H. B. No. 42 which was made the general order of
the day.

Accordingly the House resolved itself
into a committee of the whole and
the report of the committee on ways
and means to which the bill had been
referred, was read. The committee
recommended its passage.

The bill was referred to the committee
on taxation for the consideration of section 4, chapter 23,
which law of 1895, and requires the
issuing and assessment of all property
not January 1st and before the first
Sunday of March of each year, was
being discussed pro and con in the
Senate.
