OCE POLLANDER KILLS ANOTHER.

Beds from Expenses—Third \$10 for

An effort is being made to reorganize
the Grand Junction, Colo., Jewellers
company, which declined last Friday.

A railroad passenger was killed, from
about 6 A. M. on Wednesday, about thirty
miles from Ogallala, Neb., when his
