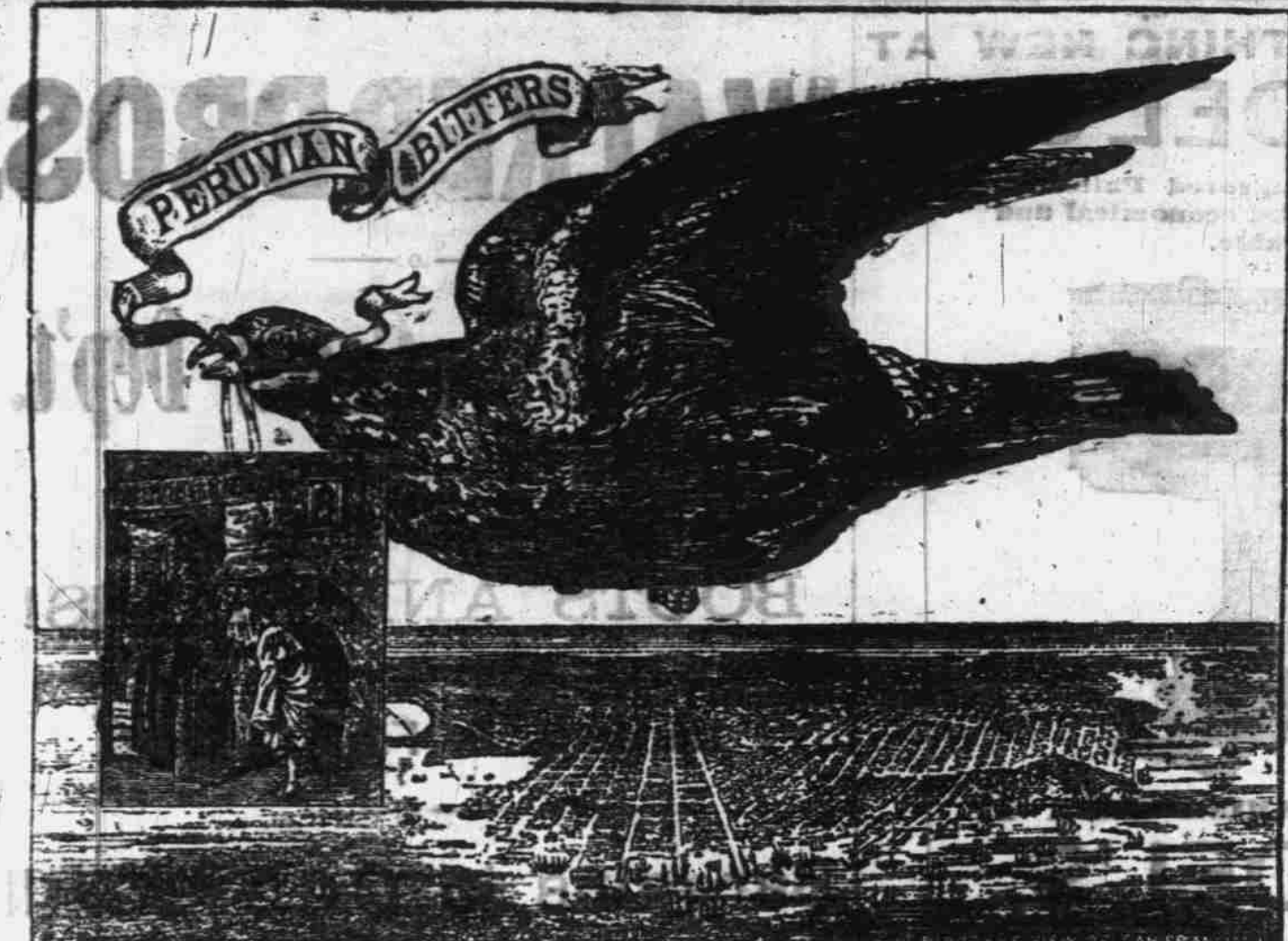

EVENING NEWS.

BRIEF TELEGRAMS.

Guayaquil, 23.—Last night the ship was very heavy from 9 to 11. So it was for a short period about 3 this morning. It is reported that many were killed of Venetianella's ship.

Montreal, Canada, 23.—The Canadian and European Steamship Company will run a monthly line between Bremen, Germany, and this port, having obtained a subsidy of \$2,000 per trip.

Philadelphia, 23.—Jay Gould, accompanied by Edward Gould and his friends Charles H. Williams and Samuel H. Cramp, left the city this afternoon on board Gould's new yacht, the *Atlanta*, for New York, where she will be exhibited to Gould's friends.

Boston, 23.—Boston 6, Philadelphia 2.

Providence, 23.—Providence 12, New York 4.

Cleveland, 23.—Cleveland 3, Chicago 0.

Buffalo, 23.—Buffalo 7, Detroit 0.

Chicago, 23.—Opening day of the Summer meeting of the Chicago Olympic Club. Weather cloudy and sultry; track low attendance large, betting heavy. Five events were on the card. The races were characterized by spirited contests, but those were slow and exciting finishes. The favorites were beaten in two races, but won in the others.

Chicago, 23.—The National Exhibition of Railway Appliances, which has been in progress here one month, closed to-night. The attendance during the present week has been very great. There was a desire to keep the exhibition open two weeks longer, but the building has been leased for other purposes, and this was prevented.

Galveston, 23.—News El Paso special: Don Luis Terrell, Governor-elect of Sonora, in a conversation regarding Gen. Crook, stated that if the captured Indians were put on the reservation now and escaped again into Mexico, that the country would hold the American government responsible for all depredations committed by them upon Mexican citizens.

Galveston, 23.—News Austin special: The Supreme Court of Texas in the case of *Holy vs. Stahl*, by a majority of the bench, holds that the school of the Legislature publishing the giving away of whisky in districts where local option has been adopted is unconstitutional, in view of the provision of the Constitution which requires the Legislature to pass a law to prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors. Judge Wilson, dissenting, holds it to be constitutional, but that it is no offence to give away liquor unless it is with the purpose of evading the law.

Ottawa, 23.—The government has decided to make no further grants, to colonization and railway companies in the Northwest, at present, and until the present charter railway ways are completed there will be no further sales of lands. If, however, it is found necessary in the interests of the country to make further grants the price will be raised to 50 cents per acre. This conclusion was arrived at owing to the rapid increase of immigration into the Northwest.

Havana, 23.—The steamer from St. Thomas brings the report: **Fort San Felipe, 18.**—Severe fighting has prevailed at Mirigona. The rebel general Castner was killed, but the government troops were repulsed. After a series of engagements the rebel forces of Mirigona fell into the hands of the Government forces. The insurgents took refuge in Fort Elefante. Jermie is blockaded again, the rebels are now in the fort. Four of the ringleaders of the insurgents were shot at St. Louis and 10 at Cavaton to-day. Troops are besieging Jermie.

Keokuk, 23.—Arguments in the bond case, which have required a week in the court, held by Judge Caldwell, closed to-day. During the argument Justice Miller stated that the court was satisfied the bonds were constitutional and valid, the decision in the Arkansas supreme court to the contrary notwithstanding. As to whether lien created by the acts extended beyond the income fund revenue, of the companies to which the bonds were issued, and whether the bondholders were entitled to avail themselves of the remedies provided by the state, Justice Miller said he desired to hear argued. The cases were then taken under advisement, the attorneys on each side filing written briefs.

Chicago, 23.—Daily News' Matanzas, Mexico: One hundred and fifty revolutionaries attacked Chihuahua, Mexico, and carried off two officials. Cavalry pursued, and the revolutionaries being pressed, associated their prisoners. The revolutionaries were overthrown by the cavalry, cut to pieces, and 30 killed.
