





A STRANGE STORY. LADY WARNED THAT SHE WOULD BE MURDERED.

New York, Oct. 11 .- A strange story of ghostly interference in the affairs of men comes from Miss Lena Hernan, on whose authority it is offere to the readers of the Globe-Democrat It will form another link in the chain of evidence so fast forming from al ides, that there is a spirit world, and that spirits do love their friends who are dwellers upon earth in the flesh, and that they do undoubtedly appear to us when there is sufficient cause for their appearance. Miss Herman was a warm friend of the murdered Mrs. Lena Reich, who was so foully slain by her husband, Adelph Reich, at 144 Norfolk Street, i his city, on the night of April 19th

last. Miss Herman had not seen Mrs. Neich for several months prior to the murder, and at the time was living in Boston. She has recently moved to Brooklyn. She says:
"When I was visiting Mrs. Reich last January she was in a great deal of trouble about her husband. She had been obliged to have him bound to keep the peace, which, however, he lid not do, but abused her shamefully One day she said to me while we were sitting darning some stockings: "! ought never to have married Adolph; it was my fault, and I did it with my eyes open, for

that he would murder me! It happened this way. Adolph had been courting me for some time, and I knew that I loved him. One night, a terrible tark, storming winter night, he told me that he loved me, and offered him-self to me. I acknowledged that was not indifferent to him, but asked a few days to think over the mutte and consult my friends. Adolph di not like this delay, and tried to reason me out of it, but I was firm and carried my point. Well we sat up very late that night together, no one else but ourselves being in the room. When he finally left, it

vas past midnight, and the weather was very cold, so I fixed up the fire to nake me a cup of tea to quist my nerves and warm me up before goin to bed. 


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
