By Victor Demogeot. Ormonde-Daytona Beach, Fla., Jan. 23.— Victor Demogeot of France was crowned speed king of the world this afternoon on the Daytona sands after driving his gasoline car two miles in the marveious time of 59 4-5 seconds. Demogeot maintained a speed of 123 miles an hour to make this record. The mile-a-minute race closed the au-tomobile tournament for this season. The competition on this event narrowed down to Marriott, in the steamer, and to the big up horsepower French car, whoever should drive, Demogeot was infaily selected. On the first trial Marriott went first, but the best he could do was i minute and s seconds. Demogeot brought the crowd to fise te by reducing the time to 1 minute 12-3 seconds. Referee Morrhi accided to give each car a trial to see if the time could be brought within the minute. Marriott came first this time and faster.

It seemed impossible that the clumsy-looking French car should reduce this, but the Florida Times-Union \$1,000 trophy was lost to America a few minutes later, when Demogeot thundered over the two-mile course in 584-5 seconds, the fast-est speed ever attained by an automo-bile. Demogeot was crowned with a laurel wreath by Miss Mary Simrail of Ormonde, Fia, while several thousand persons cheered. An automobile parade followed and this ended the tourna-ment.
