NEGRO BISHOP ARRAIGNS HIS RACE FOR LAZINESS

Chicago, Aug. 3.—The Rt. Rev. Henry McNeil Turner, of Atlanta., Ga., senlor bishop of the African M. E. church, accused his race of submission to political oppression, and appealed to them to stand up and fight for their rights, in

"You men and nght for their rights, in an address here last evening. "You men and women of the colored race," he said, "do not realize your numerical power, and you are too lazy to figure it out. A popular estimate of negroes in the United States is 10,000,-000. That is far from correct. There 000. That is far from correct. There are not less than 18,000,000 today in this country, and there are 4,600 colored babies born every day. We are here and we should be a great political fac-tor or nothing. At present we are noth-ing, and as long as we submit, we shall have our liberties gradually limited."
