## LOCAL BRIEFS.

Death of Mrs. Bennion—Mrs. Esther A. Bennion of Vernal, died yesterday, and her remains will be brought to this city for interment.

## RESTAURANTS IN A BAD FIX

Police Are Going to See That They Do Not Advance the Prices On Meals.

The police are going to see that the restaurant men do not raise the prices during G. A. R. week. In the language of the street the cafe proprietors are destined to be "the fall guys." If the wholesalers have their way.

Eggs are quoted at 35 and 35.50 a case, which brings the wholesale value per dozen to 28 1/2 cents, or retail to 35 cents a dozen.

The corresponding day last year eggs were quoted at \$6.25 a case and were selling for 25 cents a dozen. The wholesalers deny that this is a concerted effort to take advantage of the G. A. R. week. They claim the conditions warrant the advance in prices. What the restaurant men and housewives say would not look well in print.
