A Suspicion Arises in the Shape of a Stolen Gold Brick.

A REMARKABLE CYCLE TRIP.

Going of Gunpowder at Phoenix. A Woman Charged With Murdering Her Parasite.

John H. Murray, a miner, fell ill last night in the hills of Butte and was instantly killed.

Pearson county has a surplus of school teachers. The 175 schools are already supplied, and about 100 teachers are without positions.

Stanley (Utah) Times: Harry Duke, treasurer of Salt Lake City, arrived this morning to spend a few days visiting at his brother's house. Eight hours after the latter's mother and sister (Mrs. Duke) were sleeping for a few weeks.

W. C. Denning, a resident of Black Jim, Calif., aged 15 years, and a bronco-buster on No. 17, was struck on the back of the neck in the mountains near Truckee and killed. His body was found on top of a refrigerator car, lying across the running board.

Resident from near the junction of the Laramie and North Platte rivers visiting drovers in Cheyenne. The pines have eaten the grass for miles, and the crop of hay will be very short. They appear, however, to be gradually leaving the neighborhood, but the damage already done is very great.

The deer in the mountains are fat and fatigued, and the Wyo. Game Warden (Utah) says: "The old story about the scarcity of deer is invariably told by hunters who couldn't hit a target twenty yards. After wasting lots of time and lead, these would be Indians, return to town with game shot dead being beaten."

Jessie (Utah) Times: A disreputable woman, Mrs. Cole, has been bound over to the district court in \$5,000 for murder, in administering to her paramour, Carl Gruber, a Rio Grande employee, on August 9, a dose of arsenic with the intent to kill. She admits giving him the drug, but says that he had her now much he wanted.

Snow Valley Telegraph: Some very rich ore from the South Idaho mine has lately been shown on the streets. The rock was filled with pure quartz gold and was the most valuable gold ever taken from a single vein. No miners even though no gold was visible to the eye. The rock came from a depth of 100 feet, and a hole two feet and a half had been drilled into the ledge, and it is worth not having reached.

Two members of a gang of counterfeiters who have been manufacturing and passing spurious gold at Phoenix, Ariz., for a week past, were arrested this evening. One is James Younger, the other is known as Murray. The latter is a man of unusual appearance, 5' 9 1/2", distinguished looking. Big spurs and half dollars were found upon each, with unmistakable evidence that they were made here, and were sent to the east end of the mountains with them. The rest of the other six has not been located. Both prisoners are non-committal. The town has been flooded with the most terrible money.

The summer was commenced to McMinn a few days ago, says the Franklin (Tenn.) Journal. He has an acquaintance in the form of a man named Morris who had died suddenly at that place. Morris had just arrived in this country from Panama and coming West brought with him a farm laborer who, O. H. Hartman, said, had been a slave. Morris and a partner had been taken sick and died. The investigation developed the fact that he had been a Panama fever, the germs of which he had brought with him from that tropical climate, and that he had come into contact with these men when rendered by the enemity of life. Morris was a native of Alton, Illinois, and about thirty years old. He is supposed to have friends in New York.

The sensation of the hour at White Oaks, N. M., is the recovery of a good fortune lost on the Colorado River, as on August 1. The batch, which is valued at \$5,000, was a product of the South Homestake mine in which West was interested, and had been kept secreted at his residence while preparing to go to the mountains to search for the mule. It was missed the next day after having been taken out of the house, and suspicion at once fell on Phil Schwartz, who, with his wife, were recently married to Wm. Collier and Mrs. West, and were suspicious of the presence of the treasure in the house, the master was kept very quiet and the case passed in the name of Deputy Sheriff John Preston, who conjectured that the mule had been stolen, upon which a brotherhood was formed between West and, and only obtained a confession of their guilt, but recovered the gold as well. No criminal action has been taken as yet against the thief, but for the last two days have been engaged in the recovery of his lost fortune at White Oaks, and had nothing very well thought of.

A remarkable bicycle trip was concluded at Fresno, Cal., on Friday night. W. B. Holland left Fresno three weeks ago on a wheel, and after visiting Monterey, San Francisco and Sacramento, crossed the Sierras by the way of Lake Tahoe to Carson, Nev. From there the difficult course began. He determined to go to Yosemité by following sheep trails. Monday night the party in their wagon had driven through Alpine, and on Tuesday the Valley, covered with sagebrush whither there are no roads, he reached the foot of a mountain where nine thousand feet with only a narrow, rugged trail leading up. He hired a Chinese to carry his load, and followed the trail nine miles and then set forward for the Yosemité, fifty miles distant, with only sheep trails to follow, and in some places scarcely any path at all. He passed the night in a hole in a rock, with a gun and a rifle, and when daylight came down the other side of the mountain into the Yosemite, where he could again ride. The entire trip from the time he left Fresno to the close of his tour took 100 miles, the greater part of which was over country where no single had ever been before. The longest ride in one day was 100 miles, the shortest nine miles. There was no accident or breakdown on the road, not even a punctured tire.
