The new site calls for seven miles of spur track railroad to connect with the San Pedro railroad and an addi-tional seven miles to connect with the Western Pacific railroad near Garfield. It would require five miles of railroad to connect the site with Tocele city direct (a town of 1,500 population). Plans and specifications have been completed for new simelting plant, pro-viding for a daily treatment of 1,500 tons."
