

EDITORIAL NOTES.

—The New York *Herald* says, "Why coal intended for the destitute should cost more than the market rate is a problem we should like to see explained."

—The colleges of female physicians throughout the United States are said to have more matriculants this year than ever before.

—In the House of Representatives, Feb. 1, Mr. Cannon of Utah presented the petition of William W. Maguire, G. D. Folkman, Moroni Skeen, and others, of Plain City, Utah Territory, for cheap telegraphy, to the committee on Post Office and Post Roads.

—The London glass warehouses now advertise toughened tumblers, wine and other glasses.

—Sir Titus Salt, the English philanthropic manufacturer, had a funeral two miles long.

—The trees are budding out in Richmond, Va., and the *Whig* of that place thinks they have made a mistake of two months.

—Miss Mary E. Beedy, of England, told the woman suffragists of Boston, recently, that women voted in her country in all elections, except those for members of Parliament.

—In the House of Representatives, Feb. 1, Mr. Cannon, of Utah, presented the petition of citizens of Rush Lake, Utah, for cheap telegraphy, to the Committee on Post Office and Post Roads.

—Spurgeon thinks that places of worship should be comfortable, so as to give the Gospel a fair chance, and men should not be like the negro who sowed a tenth of his field for the Lord, but did not find time to hoe "de Lord's potatoes."

—The Brooklyn *Argus* says, "The eminently respectable citizen" is all right until he embezzles the funds of his bank or runs off with his neighbor's wife. Such little irregularities seem to cause a suspension of public opinion as to his respectability for six, eight, or twelve months, as the case may be, and after that he is just as respectable as ever."

—Mr. Hill Keith, of Wade Forest Township, N. C., says the Raleigh *News*, married, as his third wife, Mrs. Pennington, mother of Miss Pennington, his second wife.

—How much can a man carry? Experiments made in France are reported as resulting as follows—Heaviest load a strong man can carry for a short distance 319 lbs.; all a man can carry habitually, as, for example, a soldier's knapsack, walking on level ground, is 132 lbs., or an aggregate of 1,518 pounds over 3,200 feet as a day's work. If he ascend ladders or stairs, as do hod-carriers, he can carry but 121 pounds continuously, and his day's work cannot exceed 1,232 pounds raised 3,200 feet high.

—A New York *Herald's* London cablegram says "An officer of the Royal Horse Guards Blue has backed himself against a certain sporting baronet to ride ten miles across fair hunting country while a snail crawls ten inches on a greased board. Odds five to four on the snail."

—The Indianapolis *Journal* has the following instance of profuse generosity—"On the night of the Academy of Music fire, four drivers on the Illinois street car line, being cut off from the stables by hose across the track, voluntarily made trips north until 2 o'clock in the morning, taking in \$15 or \$20 extra for the company. The management munificently rewarded the enterprising drivers for their work by adding fifteen cents to the weekly pay of each. One of the poor fellows, overwhelmed at such liberality, begged to be allowed to take the amount in instalments. He was afraid he could not stand prosperity."

—The New York *Herald* says, "A tremendous temperance movement is in progress at Trenton, N. J., and if it is not arrested in its course there will either have to be an adjournment of the legislature or a disbanding of the lobby. Legislative jobs cannot be managed without whisky."

—It is stated that a number of Germans residing in France have received, since the beginning of the year, an invitation from the German government to return to their country before March, if they wish to avoid serious legal consequences."

—A suit has been commenced in New York to restrain a man

from continuing the business of preparing old tea leaves with various poisonous substances, to be sold to the public as good new tea. The plaintiff wishes to continue the business himself, and that is the reason why he wants his rival restrained. The principal substances used in this business, in addition to the old tea leaves, are said to be plumbago, China clay, Russian blue, turmeric, gypsum, and indigo.

—The Springfield *Republican* thinks it would advance the era of good feeling for President Tilden to place Governor Hayes in his cabinet. On the other hand, Gov. Hayes is credited with having proposed, prior to the Cincinnati convention, that President Hayes place Gov. Tilden in his cabinet.

—The Washington *Star* of February 8th says—"Secretary Morrill continues to improve, his condition this afternoon being still favorable. The President visited him this morning, and the Secretary expressed his regret that he should be sick at this particular time. He takes but little nourishment as yet, and positively declines stimulants, being a conscientious temperance man. The belief is expressed by his attendants that he will shortly recover."

—The Springfield (Mass.) *Republican* has the following, the incident occurring at Plainville, in that State—"Deacon Hamlin died of paralysis, as was supposed, and a large assembly gathered in the church for the funeral Friday afternoon. But, during the services, the audience grew restless, the corpse stirred, was hastily carried from the house, restoratives were applied, and, at the last accounts, the good deacon seemed to have taken a new lease of life."

—San Francisco is agitated about "Spring Valley bugs" and the "horrible organisms that inhabit the water," the pipes having "millions in them."

—Chicago has blue glass on the brain. Scarlet fever and diphtheria are there also.

THE DRUIDS.—A London correspondent of the Cincinnati *Commercial* says that on a recent Sunday evening, "the ancient Druids of South Wales gathered together on the Pontyfridd common, and within a serpent circle, marked with signs of the zodiac, performed their worship. The archdruid, with mistletoe on his breast, stood by his bethel or holy stone and offered a prayer to the great Kall, 'author of the sun, moon, stars, and universe.' He then initiated several bards, causing each to ascend the stone with a sprig of mistletoe in his hand. The ancient Druids are not limited to Wales. They have organizations in various parts of Southern England, their most important society out of Wales being at Oxford. Pontyfridd is the great see of this religion, whose antiquity makes Rome modern and Canterbury a thing of yesterday. The archdruid then, at the close of the proceedings, stated that their religion was making great progress in the United States, and already numbered many distinguished citizens there among its adherents. He read then a formal application from America for a charter, and the bards, acting as a convocation, granted the same."
