SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 20.—The

appropriation committee

approved the House

recess resolution.

House denied the committee

had recommended that

the committee be

recessed until the

committee had reported

on the bill.

During the morning hour, Miller

presented petitions for a post-office

building at San Francisco.

Senator Stanford introduced a bill,

requesting the admission of Utah as a

state.

Miller reported the recess

resolution; Conger objected.

The Senate considered the

diplomatic appropriation bill.

The committee reported the

bill with amendments, and

the civil service bill was

reconsidered.

Allison said a circular that

purported to have been

issued by the Republican

State Committee of Pennsylvania

had no relation to the

Congressional Committee.

He thought it deserved

the condemnation of every

member of the Republican

party.

Westcott said the great

event in the civil service

was the Republican party.
