WHY NOT TAX DOGS.

An Illinois farmer wants this question answered: "Why should not dogs help to pay the war debt?" He says:

So great is the number of dogs in the United States, that their bare support is an enormous burden on the country, with no corresponding benefit; for probably not more than one-fourth are worth their keeping—the balance are worse than useless, endangering human life and being very destructive to sheep, causing many to abandon sheep-husbandry, and deterring others from embarking in the business who otherwise would; consequently we import wool largely—over \$1,000,000 annually in 1845 and 1846, (since which dates I have no statistics at hand.)

A Cleveland paper states there were in Ohio, in 1831, 42,781 sheep killed by dogs—valued at \$64,216 25; and in the same period there were injured, 19,000—valued at \$32,579 70. Total, 61,681 sheep—valued at \$96,794 95.

I see in another paper, lately, that two men have died from hydrophobia, and another had a hundred sheep killed by dogs in Northern Indiana; all these are only samples of what I have read during the past week.

Congress is proposing to tax sheep, hogs, and all the necessaries of life, and racking its brain to tax every kind of thing—it did propose to tax dogs, but for some unaccountable reason, or for want of reason, has struck that out. Why should not dogs help to pay the war debt, and do something to make up in part for their depredation on the country? No intelligent patriot, who owns a dog, will object to such a tax.

A CAMPAIGN INCIDENT.

It is related that during the campaign on the Shenandoah, one of Fremont's batteries, supported by a squadron of horse, was engaged in a sharp conflict with a battery of the enemy, and shot and shell were flying thick and fast, when the commander of the battery, a German, one of Fremont's staff, rode suddenly up to the cavalry, exclaiming—
"Pring up the shackasses; for Col sake hurry up the shackasses im-me-diate-ly!"
The necessity for this order will be obvious when it is known that the "shackasses" were mules carrying mountain howitzers, which are fired from the backs of those much abused but valuable animals; and the immediate occasion for the "shackasses" was that two regiments of rebel infantry were at that moment discovered descending a hill immediately behind our batteries. The "shackasses," with the howitzers loaded with grape and canister, were soon on the ground. The mules squared themselves, as they well knew how, for the shock. A terrific volley was poured into the advancing column, which immediately broke and retreated. Two hundred and seventy-eight dead bodies were found in the ravine next day, piled closely together as they fell, the effects of that volley from the backs of the "shackasses."
