TRADING SHOWS MORE STRENGTH

Nevadas and Utahs Share Attention of Dealers—Confidence Is Growing.

DALY-JUDGE NOW AT \$8 MARK.

Two Sales Made Around That Figure
—Ingot is Heavy Seller—Eagle's Nest Drops.

A better day was noticed this morning on the local mining stock exchange and it appears that former confidence is being restored gradually. The Nevadas are coming in for a generous share of attention and are well up among the sellers. May Day has been in demand during the past several days and during today's trading dropped a half cent. It opened at \$4 at which figure 600 shares changed hands. This sale (made during the regular call) was followed on the open board by two sales, one involving 500 of the same price and the other, 1,000 at \$3 1/2. Daly-Judge was loosened from its stand of yesterday and went at \$5 and \$6. At the first price 300 went and at the second, 350. Stray Dog saluted a cent during the regular call and Ingot dropped 1/4 cents. Star Con. gained a cent and a half, while Colorado Mining dropped 2 1/2%.

Yankee was active around to \$1 and 52 mark, 1,000 going for \$1 during the regular call; another thousand for the same price on the open board and 200 at \$2. It was an "up-and-down" morning and all in all was satisfactory to dealers. Ingot was a heavy seller, 6,500 being transferred at prices ranging from 10¢ to 34¢. Eagle's Nest took a three-cent drop in its sales; 300 going at 25¢ followed by the sale of 300 at 25¢. The day's sales totals and closing quotations follow:

MAKES GREAT RECORD.

Park City Ships Millions of Pounds of Ore During March.

Park City, April 5.—Park City made a great record for the month past despite the bad conditions of roads between the depot and the mines in the Empire and Silver King and the Daily West were the heaviest shippers, each contributing several million pounds of ore.

ASSESSMENT LEVIED.

Daly Wants Big Sum to Pay for Drain Tunnel Expense.

The Daily announces an assessment of 25 cents per share. This amounts to \$100,000 levied by the company to pay for its share of work in opening the Ontario drain tunnel. The assessment must be paid before or by May 4, and sale day is May 24. What is left over after drain tunnel expenses met will be used in developing the Daly itself. This assessment was not fully unexpected as it was known that the Daly company had no big amount of funds when the Banningers secured control at the first of the year.

J. R. Hascin's restaurant as treasurer and a director was accepted and W. S. McCormick was selected to fill the vacancy thus created. H. G. McMillian was selected to succeed L. C. Cobath as a director. Mr. Cobath resigned also.

MINERS KEEP AWAY.

The Ontario drain tunnel trouble at Park City is not adjusted yet and the miners appear obdurate. The men will not return to work for a cent less than \$5 per day of eight hours and consider that they are not particularly anxious to risk their lives for that figure. The only new development in the affair is the part now being taken by the Miners' union. Signs warning all miners to keep away from the Ontario drain tunnel are being posted all over the camp, until the present trouble has been adjusted.

SOUTHWEST UNTOUCHED.

Copper Mining Interests Have Not Been Affected by Financial Flurry.

Prescott, Ariz., April 5.—Copper mining interests in the southwest have been little affected by the recent financial flurry, and all the mining camps are reporting unabated activity. The fact that German buyers are in the market for copper and are paying as high as 100 per cent per pound for July delivery to only a sample of the many encouraging conditions now stimulating the copper producers to exert themselves to their limit. A number of splendid properties are now reported as upon the very verge of the production stage, probably the most notable of these being the Mansfield in Santa Fe, N. M. The financing of this company has just been brought to a successful completion, and very heavy production is the unanimous prediction of all mining men familiar with the geology of the district.

RECORD ORE CONTRACT.

Palmillo Silver Mine at Parral, Mexico Enters Into Huge Deal.

El Paso, Tex., April 4.—Probably the largest ore contract ever entered into in any mining district has been made between Eugene Davis of Washington, C. and Pedro Alvarado, a millionaire of Mexico, and owner of the Palmillo mine.

Under the contract Mr. Davis is to have the entire output of milling ore of the Palmillo mines for 25 years at \$18 per ton and the minimum daily delivery is to be 1,000 tons.

Mr. Davis is interested with capitalists of Paris in the Capazaya mines, contiguous to the Alvarado mines, and they will be erected a reduction works for treatment of the output of both mines.

IDaho LOOKS GOOD.

McKinley Gold Mines and Other Properties Attract Kansas City Capital.

Idaho City, Id., April 5.—The McKinley Gold Mines company is now making rapid progress in the development of its mineral property on Jupiter mountain where high grade gold have been demonstrated by extensive prospect work. A large tunnel bore is to be started at once which is expected to penetrate at least five miles of solid rock. The company's plan is to be located at the portal and the gravity system of handling will be largely employed. This company is being backed by a number of Kansas City business men; and the initial sale of treasury stock is said to have met with phenomenal success, the public showing a decided interest in the properties and the increasing popularity of southern Idaho and the Boise Basin as an investment field.

MILLIONS IN SIGHT.

Pelican Point Has Marble Equal to Any Ever Found.

Provo, April 5.—Walter Parkes, of the Pelican Point Development company is in Provo with some fine samples of the various material such as stone, slate, cement, rock, etc., of which his company has large deposits in the mountains above the lake. The most beautiful and valuable of the specimens brought over this time is some black marble streaked with white. This takes a perfect polish and experts have assured the company that it is equal in quality to any other black marble. It has been estimated that there are 30,000,000 worth in sight. Mr. Parkes expects that a large quantity of this will be used in some of the big buildings about to be erected in Salt Lake this summer.

His company is putting up machinery of various kinds on the ground and developing its property as rapidly as possible. It is planned to have the boats will be put on the lake to transport the materials which the company expects to ship to this side and from here by rail to different points to market.
