WHEAT.—Recent experiments prove that a frequent cause of smut in wheat is the heating of the seed in the mow or stack. One who has tried, recommends to let the wheat for seed stand until quite ripe before cutting and then to put it on a scaffold until fully cured. DEAR BROTHER CARRINGTON:—I write to inform you of the sudden death of WILLIAM COOK MITCHELL, senior, which happened on the morning of the 20th inst., about 5 1-2 o'clock, by the accidental upsetting of his wagon loaded with a saw log, which passed over his body and head, crushing him so severely that he survived but a few minutes.

Brother Mitchell was born in Yorkshire, England, Jan. 14, 1803, emigrated to Nauvoo in 1841, left there for these valleys in May, 1846, but was sent from Winter Quarters in the fall of the same year on a mission to England, from whence he returned in 1849, arriving in Salt Lake valley the same year. Was one of the first settlers of Parowan, under the direction of Prest. G. A. Smith, in Jan. 1851, where he has resided up to the time of his death. He was a member of the 12th Quorum of Seventies.
