DEAR BROTHER CARRINGTON:-I write to inform you of the sudden death of WILLIAM COOK MITCH-ELL, senior, which happened on the morning of the 20th inst., about 5 1-2 o'clock, by the accidental upsetting of his wagon loaded with a saw log, which passed over his body and head, crushing him so severely that he survived but a few minutes.

Brother Mitchell was born in Yorkshire, England, Jan. 14, 1805, emigrated to Nauvoo in 1841, left there for these valleys in May, 1846, but was sent from Winter Quarters in the fall of the same year on a mission to England, from whence he returned in 1849, arriving in Salt Lake valley the same year. Was one of the first settlers of Parowan, under the direction of Prest. G. A. Smith, in Jan. 1851, where he has resided up to the time of his death. He was a member of the 12th Quorum of Seventies.
