LOCAL BREVIETIES.

LAST COURT NEWS.

Theodore E. Loring, Patrick Quinn, William Morris and White Knapp filed complaint in the Third District Court today against Joseph Shadecome, William Bartlett, William Fox, H. Rockwell and others. The plaintiffs allege that in May, 1892, and for two years previous thereto, they and others did commit larceny in the Tinajas mining district, and that the defendant, with force entered said mine in May last, and caused and intended to do damage to the property therein stored since, to the injury of plaintiffs to the amount of \$100.

Habeas corpus and recovery of said property were granted by the plaintiffs and costs damages. An injunction to restrain defendants from further operating said mine is also asked for. Powers & Hill are attorneys for the plaintiffs. Judge Anderson was around the Third District Court during the forenoon but no business was transacted.

Death of a Venerable Lady.

Catherine MacLean Harrocks, widow of the late Peter Harrocks, died at 10:45 a.m. today, August 18th, at the residence of her son, Elder W. R. Donald, 49 north West Temple street, of general weakness superinduced by old age. Decended was born in Dumfries, Scotland, October 5, 1808.

Sister Harrocks embraced the Gospel in 1833, in Aughton, Lancashire, England, and emigrated to Utah in 1845. She passed through the various trials and vicissitudes incident to life in Utah in early times, with cheerfulness and unwavering integrity to the truth. She rejoiced in the principles of the gospel when she first came, and clung to them with a devoted and honest heart, cheerfully leaving friends and all former ties, to comply with the duty she felt resting upon her to leave her native land for the Church. She was an undeviating earnest worker, diffusing joy and comfort in the hearts of all who knew her, and was one of nature's truly noble souls. Her talents and her charity for the weakness of others were among her conspicuous characteristics. She has gone to join the host of the pure and righteous who have preceded her and finally to enter the Celestial Kingdom of God. Sister Harrocks had been a widow for over 20 years. The funeral will be held on Saturday evening at 7 p.m., at the residence of W. R. Donald, 49 N. West Temple street.
