BY TELEGRAPH. FORTY-SEVENTH CONGRESS. WASHINGTON, 17.—Sherman called up a resolution directing the Secretary of the Treasury to transmit to the Senate a copy of the report. Mr. James T. Meinel Farley asked the consideration postponed until Friday.

AMERICAN. Confirmed. WASHINGTON, 17.—The Senate confirmed Robert G. Holly, of Vermont, United States consul, Barbados. Seymour J. Hanna, register of lands, Louisville, Col.; Augustus Brassius, Indian Agent of Great Nebraska Agency, Neb.; John Harris, District of Columbia Indian agent for Nemaha Agency, Idaho; John W. Crawford, Dakota, agent at Devil's Lake; James McLaughlin, Dakota agent at Standing Rock; George L. Spencer, Minn., agent at Crow Creek, Dakota.

Fatal Accident. This morning the steamship Crescent City capsized while in the dry dock and was badly damaged. John Hart, fireman, was killed.

Chicago, 17.—Startling figures are given showing great and steady increase of pyrexia, or measles, in the city. Dr. Branch, of the Chicago Dispensary, says that the measles epidemic is due to the unhealthy condition of the streets, and in no degree to the large influx of low classes of immigrants. Last week there were 86 deaths from typhoid fever, and the number this week is still greater. In January, 1876, there were 18 deaths from measles, in May 48, August 46, September 108, and so far in October 79. The entire mortality in January was 67, in May 147, in August 107, and in September 147. Unless there is decided relief in the street cleaning service, even greater mortality is probable.

His Excellency. St. Louis, 17.—A very large meeting of Irishmen was held in St. Patrick's Hall, yesterday afternoon, at which speeches were made by several prominent Irishmen, and resolutions were adopted, all strongly denouncing the English government for the arrest of Parnell. A committee was also appointed to arrange for a monster outdoor meeting to be held on Wednesday, the anniversary of the surrender of Yorktown. The meeting was very large, and the feeling among the Irish men of the city engaged in the movement, and the meeting will probably be the largest ever held here. The feeling among the Irish men is very bitter.

Philadelphia, 17.—Many meetings were held to-day to denounce the arrest of Parnell. Two thousand people attended an indignation meeting at the skating rink to-day. Mayor Kelley declined an invitation to preside and Congressional office remained away. Formidable Fire. MEMPHIS, 17.—A fire at Humboldt destroyed 20 storehouses, including two squares on both sides of Main Street, also the Humboldt factory, post office and the West Tennessee Dry Goods Co. The entire business portion of the city was burned. Loss about \$175,000; insurance, \$5,000.
