

TAFTS GUESTS AT WHITE HOUSE

President and Mrs. Roosevelt Will
Be Their Hosts Until the
Inauguration.

THEN HOLD FAMILY REUNION

President-elect Easily Defeated Gen.
Clarence R. Edwards at Golf—Good
Joke on Secret Service Man.

Washington, March 2.—As the guests of President and Mrs. Roosevelt, President-elect and Mrs. Taft will begin their occupancy of the White House tomorrow night, going there for dinner and remaining.

After the inauguration there will be a reunion of the various members of the Taft family at the White House.

Miss Helen, Robert and Charlie, the three children of the president-elect, arrived tonight. Miss Della Torrey, 32 years old, of Milbury, Mass., the only representative of the Taft family of the last generation, is here. She is a sister of Mr. Taft's mother, and has lived with his parents since his boyhood. There is a strong affection between the incoming president and his maiden aunt. Her life has been an inspiration to him in a number of speeches he has delivered to young women students, particularly in his advice to them not to consider marriage the only object to be attained. Mr. Taft has stated that the loveliness of character developed by self-sacrificing unmarried women has shown that there may be much in a single life.

Mr. Taft enjoyed a golf game on the Chevy Chase course today. He defeated handsily his opponent, Captain R. Edwards, and remarked with some regret that he believed he would be unable to get away for a game tomorrow, which makes the play today the last he will have of his favorite form of exercise until after he is president. Returning from the course in his new automobile, Mr. Taft somewhat enjoyed the experience of leaving behind in the mud a member of his secret service guard, who had undertaken to make the trip on a motorcycle.

The Oregon delegation in Congress called on Mr. Taft today with reference to a federal judgeship.

After dinner tonight Mr. Taft called at the residence of Thomas F. Walsh, who is entertaining a large house party for the inauguration.

Mr. Taft tonight gave a hearty handshake to more than a score of the country's most hardworking and gallant citizens, most reckoned because these qualifications were prescribed before their appointment as aides to the floor committee of the inaugural bill.

The aides, who represent practically every state, were guests at a dinner given by Thomas Walsh, vice-chairman of the committee, and the function was one of the most notable among the pre-inauguration events.

AMERICAN WOOL CO.
New York, March 2.—The annual meeting of the American Wool company was held in Jersey City today. The president reported that during the past year there was a reduction of the volume of goods business to \$29,886,978. In spite of this depression he reported the company earned over one-half of its preferred dividend, paying the balance out of the surplus, which by such payment is reduced to \$8,945,705.

The statement of profits for the year shows net sales and other income amounting to \$29,886,978; cost and expenses, \$25,706,272, leaving net profits of \$4,180,706, a decrease of \$2,146,101 as compared with the previous year.

HOUSE DEFEATS SHIP SUBSIDY BILL

Provided for Paying \$4.60 Per
Nautical Mile to American Mail
Steamships of 16 Knots.

DENOUNCED IN STRONG TERMS

Moon Called it an "Infernal Fraud"—
Champ Clark Said It Was an "Out-
rage to a Civilized Country."

Washington, March 2.—What is commonly known as the ship subsidy bill was taken up in the house today. An understanding was reached whereby four hours and a half should be devoted to debate, and that at the end of that time a vote should be taken.

The principal feature of the bill is the provision that American mail steamships of 16 knots or over and of not less than 2,000 gross tons, shall be paid \$4.60 per nautical mile outward bound on routes of 4,000 miles or upward to South America, the Philippines, Asia and Australasia.

Mr. Overstreet, in charge of the bill, explained it, and he was followed by Mr. Landis of Indiana, who made an earnest plea for the passage of the bill.

BILL DENOUNCED.
Mr. Moon (Tenn.) led the opposition to the measure.

"It is an infernal fraud, designed to plunder the treasury," he declared. Speaking of the provision for the training of American boys and answering the plea of patriotism advanced by Mr. Landis, he said it was but a blind to hide the giving of the people's money to corporations or shippers.

The climax came when Minority Leader Clark declared that a lobby had been carried on "right on the floor of the house" in favor of the bill.

"It is an outrage to a civilized country," he declared, "the thing of coaxing men, of button-holing men, and I undertake to say that when Mr. Moon denounced this bill as an infernal fraud he used language that he was justified in using."

The debate against the bill was closed by Mr. Cockran of New York. He denounced sending the American flag abroad by a subsidy, "as an outrageous concession to the existing of a people through the agency of a government."

As their champion, the advocates of the bill put forth Representative Fassett of New York. He referred to the condition of the battleship fleet on its return as showing that Americans could build as good machinery and had as good commanders as any country in the world. But no tender carrying the American flag was with the fleet, he added.

"The wars of the future will not be gun wars," said Mr. Fassett. "But trade wars."

"There will be war to get goods to the world's markets. In that war we cannot choose weapons, but must fight with the weapons of our opponents. We must face facts, not syllogisms."

The feeling in the house was strained as the hour of voting approached. The attendance was probably the largest of the session. Every one recognized that the vote would be close. Representatives of Goldfield of New York, who was operated on yesterday in a hospital, was carried on the floor in a chair to vote against the bill.

Others to speak for the bill were Gossel of Ohio, Landis of Indiana, Hunsberry, Washington, and Hobson, Alabama.

A WILD SCENE.
A scene of wild confusion followed the calling of the vote. The announcement of the vote of 172 in the affirmative, speaker hesitated for a moment, and then said, "175 in the negative." The Democratic side of the house broke forth in cheers.

Mr. Overstreet, in charge of the bill, was recognized, and he asked to be permitted to change his vote. This would have allowed him to move to reconsider and have another vote. The speaker informed him that the vote had been announced and his request came too late.

Thirty Republicans voted against the measure and four Democrats for it, as follows:

GIRLS CRUSHED TO DEATH.
Chicago, March 3.—Two girls, hastening with laughter on their lips to spend an evening of merry-making with friends, were fatally crushed between two heavy "pay-as-you-enter" cars last night. They were Marcia Ohi, 17 years old, and Agatha Reinhold, 16 years old.

Miss Ohi was so severely injured that she died in a few minutes after she had been taken to a hospital.

Miss Reinhold lingered in agony until almost midnight when death relieved her.

**TO PROTECT MINISTERS
AGAINST DIVORCE LIARS**

Chicago, March 3.—Chicago clergymen heartily endorse a bill introduced in the legislature providing for fine or imprisonment for divorced persons who by falsehood or misrepresentation, prevail upon ministers to marry them. It is intended to remedy a defect in the state law which provides that no divorced person shall re-marry within one year, and in some cases two years after the decree of divorce. This act provides no means whereby the clerk issuing the license or the clergyman performing the ceremony can ascertain the facts except by inquiry to the principals in the marriage and provides no penalty for the making false answers.

"The Catholic church is in favor of the bill," said Chancellor M. Guine. "While the church recognizes no such thing as divorce, we have canonical impediments which operate to annul a marriage. Misrepresentation in regard to one of these impediments occasionally induces a priest to perform a marriage ceremony that is against the law."

**LONG ISLAND SOUND

New York, March 3.—A house which

CONTRACT FOR AEROPLANE.
New York, March 3.—A contract was
signed yesterday by which an Ameri-
can institution purchases the first aero-
plane acquired in this country and
made solely by an American. The price
is \$5,000.

The Aeronautical society of New York
is the purchaser. They have bought
from Glenn H. Curtiss of Hammonds-
port, N. Y., an aeroplane constructed
along the lines of the June Bug, in
which Mr. Curtiss won the Scientific
American cup on July 4, by making
flight of one mile. Mr. Curtiss will
demonstrate the flying ability of the
machine at Morris Park race track in
May. After Mr. Curtiss has made a
number of flights in the aeroplane he
will teach such members of the society
as are designated in the contract.
