Army officers here think that the Jap-anese have decided that with the railroad connecting Port Arthur with the outside world cut, thus preventing supplies from reaching the place, two weeks' privation will render the final assault easier.

Moreover, as Port Arthur can be safely left as it is for the time being, the Japanese troops may be employed instead in northern Korea and near the Yalu river, where they are now most needed.
