OBITUARY

Killed at Wellsville, Cache Valley, July 21st, 1881, by being run over by his team and wagon, DANIEL HILL; born April 2d, 1807, in Johnston, Scotland. Emigrated to Canada when about 13 years of age, with his father's family of 9 persons; assisted to clear off two farms, the first in the Bathurst District, township of Lanark, where they lived some twelve years, then moved to the Home District, Canada west; here he married Elizabeth Bryce, cleared another farm and, in the spring of 1840, first heard the gospel preached by Elder Samuel Lake, who bap ized him, his wife and all his father's family, and in the fall of 1842 gathered with the Saints to Nauvoo, Illinois, and when the Presidency had to leave in the winter of 1845, he took his team and went as far as Garden Grove; returned, took his family into Waterioo, Iowa; ran a flour mill a year or more, after which he went to Warsaw, Illinois, where he attended a steam flour mill, and had many an encounter with the notorious Tom Sharp, and many others for two or three years. Fmigrated to Salt Lake City in 1852; lived in the Ninth Ward till the move south; attended President Young's mills here and at Box Elder.
