er's license shall be made in writ ing to the Mayor, and upon payment to the City Treasurer of a One copy one year, with Postary .... \$3.66 yearly license fee of five dollars, and giving a bond with approved security, to the acceptance of the Mayor, in the penal sum of five hundred dollars, conditioned for the faithful observance of the ordinances, rules and regulations, relating to the Salt Eake City Water Works. The Mayor is authorized to license such applicant, which Here shall be issued and registered in the same manner as other licenses.

SEC. 3.-No plumber shall make an extension of any pipe or water fixture attached to the water supply for the purpose of conducting water to any other part of the same building or adjoining premises, for any purpose whatever, without first obtaining a permit therefor from the Superintendent of Water Works; and plumbers, upon completing any plumbing work connected, or to be connected with the water works, shall, within twenty-four hours, report the same to said Superintendent.

SEC. 4.- No stop or draw cocks shall be used in connection with the water works where the opening for water is over a quarter of an inch in diameter, except the kind known as compression cocks.
