Arraignments before Judge Birch's Court Today.

LAWYER E. E. BISHOP COPIES UP

Charles Thode Charged With Murder; Notary in Trial on Friday.

Associate Justice Birch got through a heap of work at his desk in the division of the Third circuit court this morning. A large number of arraignments were made, among the defendants present being Charles Thode, the Murray entrepreneur, who has been indicted by the grand jury for the willful murder of his wife at Murray in April of the present year, and Attorney E. E. Bishop, arrested yesterday on charges of perjury and criminal trial.

Judge Birch admitted another set of new witness and took up some cases on the law and motion calendar. He did not have time full throughout the day.

THE MURRAY TRAGEDY.

Charles Thode, charged with the willful murder of his wife, Mary Thode, at Murray, on April 1st, also was at express today.

He was arraigned for the second defendant, who was accused of the crime. It was a case, however, of some importance, and he would like to have time to examine the witness before he can make up his mind.

He was arraigned for the third defendant, who was charged with being present at the scene of the crime.

James Thode, son of the young man who recently attempted to commit suicide in the county jail, was held in custody yesterday afternoon by the court officers that no further action be taken against him. Judge Birch then asked that the defendant be given the benefit of the doubt. He said, "I am ready to take a risk." The court, however, in view of the circumstances, was very decided that the case be set for trial as early as possible.

The court directed that the defendant be held for trial on Friday.

There appeared to be no undue haste in taking the action, for the better during his incarceration in the county jail the man has had the benefit of several hours of time, and no court hearing was held, and the man was held in custody without any trial or examination, and no complaint was filed.

The arraignment was agreed upon by the court and the defense attorney, and the man was held in custody until the morning of the offense, and that those persons most intimately acquainted with him at first knew to execute him.

REGULAR CASES.

The name of John Hagan, an ex-convict, was called for arraignment in the county of Salt Lake City, on July 21st, he was held in custody, and did not appear on his trial date, and was remanded to the county jail, and was held in custody until the 21st. ALLEGED MURDER.

LAWRENCE HUNTINGTON and J. Bryan, who were charged with the felony of harboring in a room or building, and the ownership of the property of the deceased, were arraigned before the court on Aug. 27th, 1894. Attorney W. C. Gandy was appointed to defend the two, and the court directed that they be held in custody until the 27th instant. The defense attorneys were H. D. Smith and F. W. Gandy.

THE MURKIN CASE.

Albert W. Gandy, charged for the felonies of wilfully killing and maiming his wife, was sentenced to the state prison for life. The defendant appeared to have a true good character, up to the time of this offense. He had been in the Union Statehouse, and it was stated, was immediately discharged.

THE RAYFIELD GUILTY.

Albert W. L. Rayfield, charged for the felonies, waived the reading of the indictment in the case of Jacqueline Dohmen, indicted for robbery, pleaded guilty and will be sentenced on Thursday, the 27th inst.
