

## SERVICES AT THE TABERNACLE.

Elders B. H. Roberts and Heber J. Grant the Speakers Yesterday Afternoon.

## DIVINITY OF BOOK OF MORMON.

Former Cites Some of Its Marvelous Predictions Supporting Its Authenticity—Latter Says Farewell.

The speakers at the Tabernacle yesterday afternoon were Elders B. H. Roberts and Heber J. Grant, the former dealing with the divine authenticity of the Book of Mormon and the latter bearing an earnest testimony prior to his departure tomorrow to take charge of the European mission. The services were presided over by President Angus M. Cannon.

The choir and congregation sang the hymn:

Redeemer of Israel,  
Our only delight,  
On whom for a blessing we call.

Prayer was offered by Bishop William B. Preston.

The choir further sang:

Zion stands with hills surrounded,  
Zion kept by power divine.

Elder B. H. Roberts was the first speaker. He began by remarking that the labor of the ministry in the Church of Christ, while in the main one of joy and satisfaction, was also one of anxiety at times with feelings of anxiety due to the consciousness that unless prompted by the Spirit of the Lord, an attempt to address the Saints of God and edify them would be useless. It was the right of the Priesthood of God to be guided by this Spirit, provided, of course, they were living worthy of such a blessing. He hoped, therefore, that this Spirit would guide the remarks he would be led to make.

The speaker said he had been engaged of late in preparing matter for the young people's associations throughout the Church, viz., matter concerning the Book of Mormon and its divinity; and he believed the study of this record would be of great benefit to all concerned. In early days the Lord save him to reprove the Saints for neglecting to study this sacred book, and of late years, thought the speaker, the attention paid to it had not been equal to its importance.

Elder Roberts then took up the subject of the Book of Mormon and stated that while its coming forth was but an incident in the work of the latter days, it was such an one that upon its divinity or non-divinity, depended, in large measure, the destiny of the mission of the Prophet Joseph, through whose instrumentality it was brought forth. The speaker referred to the many attacks made upon the Book of Mormon by learned men, and cited one by the reverend Alexander Campbell, whose arguments he was called to meet while laboring as a missionary in the southern states. The discussion resulted in a great many people joining the Church in that neighborhood.

The arguments concerning the Book of Mormon were directed not against its divinity but to minor matters which had no bearing on its coming forth at all. What I would like to see, said the speaker, would be an attempt to overthrow its divinity and the truthfulness of the subject matter it contained.

Elder Roberts read from First Nephi a portion of a prophecy concerning a belief among the gentiles and Jews of the things contained in the book referred to. He cited this in support of its sacred character, despite the efforts of a crack-brained minister to the contrary. Reading further from the prophecy alluded to, Elder Roberts showed that the contents of the Book of Mormon were to be carried to all nations and were also to be preached to the descendants of those of whose existence and history it was a record.

This had been fulfilled in the latter days. The record had been presented to the remnants of the seed of Nephi—the Lamanites—making their hearts glad with the joyful news of their proud ancestry. If the Book of Mormon were the romance some had declared it to be, why did it contain such a marvelous prediction and why had that prediction been brought to pass? The Book of Mormon testified that the Lamanites would yet become a white and delightsome people, and this prophecy the speaker was willing to place side by side with the belief of modern Christianity that the Lamanites, the seed of Nephi, who were the descendants of Joseph who was sold into Egypt, would soon become extinct and disappear from view entirely. As God had spoken it, a remnant of this historic people would surely be rescued from the tottering ruins of a once mighty people.

Mormon then comes to us hope for the Jewish people. The record states that this people, after having suffered all sorts of indignities at the hands of the Gentiles, would be brought back home and settled upon their original inheritance. The speaker cited in support of this prediction the Zionist movement so ardently launched in Switzerland, in 1896. In the years intervening this movement had assumed promising proportions and the outlook was that in a few years' time the Jewish people would be gathered to the land of Palestine, which was to be dedicated to them. The Latter-day Saints in this promise and the fact that as early as 1840 Joseph Smith, the founder of the Latter-day Saint movement, dedicated the land of Palestine to this purpose. Later an apostolic company was formed and they, too, blessed and dedicated the land, and later still Apostle Francis M. Lyman, now president of the European mission, visited the Holy Land and rededicated it to the gathering of the House of Judah. The speaker said the Jews were also predicted by Zachariah.

The speaker noted the advancement in science and art that had come to pass within the last three-quarters of a century, amounting almost to a revolution. In this age there had also dawned upon the world a flood of light from high heaven; opening the eyes of the blind to a realization of the fact that God lives, and that He designs that all men shall come unto Him in His own due time. Whence came this flood of light and truth through instrumentality? From God Himself through the medium of His Prophet, Joseph Smith, said the speaker. He was who was privileged to bring forth the Book of Mormon, a work which the Prophet Mormon, in sealing up the book, commended to the prayerful consideration of all into whose hands it might come. It was, in such a testimony as to its divinity was promised.

**ELDER GRANT SPEAKS.**

The choir, assisted by Bessie Browning and William Phillips, sang the hymn, "Who are these arrayed in White?" after which Elder Heber J. Grant of the Council of the Apostles, addressed the Saints. He said he expected to leave Tuesday afternoon on a mission to Europe and felt to rejoice that he was considered worthy to proclaim the word of God to the people. He went out, not to impart that which he merely believed, but to proclaim to all the world those things which he knew to be true. He had been blessed to know for himself that "Mormonism" so-called was true; that Joseph Smith was a Prophet of the living God, and that the Book of Mormon, of which he had spoken, was a divine record and contained the pure principles of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Elder Grant bore a fervent testimony of the work of the latter-days and invoked the blessings of God upon all who had come under its influence.

The choir sang the hymn, "Praise the Lord all Ye Nations" and the benediction was pronounced by Patriarch John Smith.

**HOW MEN ARE MADE.**

Interesting Address by Secretary Coxo of the Y. M. C. A.

General Secy. O. L. Coxo of the Y. M. C. A. made an address last night in the First Methodist church on "The Making of a Man." He said that the social, religious and educational development of Salt Lake children, and particularly the boys, was much neglected. The speaker further said:

"Some 12 years ago our idea was to rescue and reform young men and place them in surroundings where they would have no call to sin; make life attractive for them without the objectionable features. This raised a sort of hot-house man as it were, and that we did not like. The building or tearing down and rebuilding of character is like doing the same things to a brick house. In tearing it down mortar sticks to the bricks and it is hard to rebuild in new form. So with character: the old habits, like the mortar, stick to the traits which go to form a complete character. Our field, then, lay obviously among the boys. If we could take them and have the training of them during the impressionable age, we were sure we could turn out the right sort of men, honest, God-fearing citizens who would support the churches. At present only one-third of our church-going population is male, and the largest portion of that third is made up of boys. We want to work to analyze the influences which make up a boy's life, and afterward the

men, and found several distinct traits of boyhood.

"First, there is co-operation, the instinct that makes them go together in crowds; then there is activity, and we found that this is objectively religious. He has the instinct just as the savages have. We found, too, that he is not a pocket edition of a man, but just boy. Here in Salt Lake we are going to give more room to the boys' department in our new building than to the men by far. The boys' locker will be as large as the men's gymnasium. The boys are divided last May, classes naturally: Children up to 12, 'kiddies' from 12 to 14, and boys after that to 18. They will form clubs of all sorts, and as soon as enough boys who want to do a certain thing get together we let them do it, organizing a club to do it with. Organization seems to be the keynote in keeping them together."

## THE COUNTY INFIRMARY.

Much Needed Improvements Make it More Comfortable Than Ever.

The much-needed improvements at the county infirmary have been completed and that institution is now in better condition than ever before. A new boiler-house has been built and a new 60-horse power boiler installed, so that the buildings will now be properly heated and will be very comfortable. The new boiler-house is above ground and will not be affected by sewage water which was the case with the old boiler room underneath the building. The improvements cost the county about \$5,000. The sewer connections will be improved shortly, when the Kearns St. Ann's orphanage completes its new sewer pipe. It will then connect from the infirmary sewer and that will remedy the trouble with the latter's system.

## BESSIE KNECHT DEAD.

Sleeping Girl Goes to Her Final Rest After a Long Affliction.

Bessie B. Knecht, the sleeping girl, whose very peculiar case for so long attracted the attention of the public in general and the medical fraternity in particular, died last evening, at her home, 315 Post street, from the effects of her unfortunate condition. She was taken to St. Mark's hospital in February last, in an unconscious state, in which she remained for 47 days. The medical decision was that the trouble was caused by degeneration of the brain tissues, due to scarlet fever, and they could do nothing for the patient. So they sent her home and now, after 10 months, she has since received no medical attention. The girl's appetite failed her 10 days ago, and she refused food. Now she is dead.

## Alaskan Exhibit for St. Louis.

San Francisco, Nov. 9.—Frederick Kolthoff and Charles Homeler of St. Michael, Alaska, arrived here yesterday with part of a large Arctic and Alaskan collection for exhibition at the St. Louis fair. They are on their way to New York, where the collection will be shown during the winter. No exhibition will be made here, as the bulk of the exhibit is now en route for New York direct from Seattle. Kolthoff, who has much experience in Alaska, speaks hopefully of that country from an agricultural standpoint, saying that with government encouragement and establishment of proper experimental and training farms, the natives could be taught to raise abundant vegetables and stock, not only to support themselves but to supply the chief needs of the mining and fishing communities. He declares that the introduction of reindeer from northern Europe has proved a costly folly.

## New Policy for Grace Church.

Chicago, Nov. 9.—In announcing a new policy for Grace church, which will make it a church for the future, the Rev. William Waters has told of a recent gift of \$25,000. This sum, which was presented as a memorial to the late William G. Hubbard by his widow and six children, Mr. Waters said, would form the foundation for the fund needed, and he appealed to his hearers to raise the balance, \$75,000 before Easter Sunday next.

## German Ships at San Domingo.

New York, Nov. 9.—Upon the report of the mail steamer Athens, which has reached here from Santo Domingo, says the Herald dispatch from St. Domingo, W. L. Commodore Sheder, of the German squadron at this port has sent two ships, the Gazelle and the Panther to Santo Domingo to safeguard German interests.

## Russians Friendly to America.

New York, Nov. 9.—Bishop Grafton of the Protestant Episcopal diocese of Fond du Lac, Wis., has just returned from Russia where he has been trying to forward efforts to bring the Anglican and Russian communions into closer relations. He was accompanied by his chaplain, Father W. Fay.

"My mission," said the bishop, "has been to promote friendly intercourse between the branch of the Catholic church in America and the Russian orthodox communion. We were well received everywhere we went and were greatly impressed by the warm feelings of friendship which pervaded the Russians for the American church."

## MEXICAN VIEWS ON PANAMA REVOLT.

Clerical Press Says it is a Deep Laid Plot Arranged in Washington With the Rebels.

## COLOMBIA HAD NO CLEAR IDEAS

So Say the Liberal Papers, but Think Uncle Sam May Have Been Up to A Little Devilish Game.

Mexico City, Nov. 8.—The local press is much at variance in comments on Panama affairs. The clerical press says it is only a deep plot arranged in Washington with the Panama rebels, and predicts the absorption of Latin America by the colonies of the north.

Liberal party papers consider that Colombia, distracted by incessant revolutions, had no clear notion of the immense international canal question, and that the canal is demanded by the great interest of the commercial nations.

The Mexican Herald remarks: "Somebody will dig a ship canal across the lower part of Central America, either by the mainline and mosquito river of Nicaragua or by the Chagres fever route at Panama. The world's commerce, high political designs, the potent spirit of adventure and all that demand a canal. Colombia cannot build a canal. France has had all the Panama she wants for a thousand years, and Uncle Sam won't look kindly on the undertaking of the work by either the British or the Germans, and it looks as if he would have to do it himself. He has been temporarily but not successfully defeated at Bogota by bluff, and it has made him very wrathful. Hence, we agree with El Tiempo that our Uncle Sam may have been up to a little game of devilish diplomacy with the revolutionary group in Panama."

## Would Sell Their Ears.

New York, Nov. 9.—Nearly 150 men, women, boys and girls living here have manifested a willingness to part with their right ear in return for \$5,000. Telegrams by the score from nearly states show that there are numerous persons who feel in the same need of money.

The offers grow out of an advertisement by a physician offering \$5,000 for the right ear of a healthy person. The size of the ear was specified with precision and the doctor stated that sex would not matter. It appears he has a patient who has grown rich in the western mines, but had the misfortune to lose one of his ears. The doctor makes a specialty of fixing up deformed noses and ears, so that, that he needs to restore the rich miner's beauty is an ear of the right size and shape to be grafted on. Many of those who called had not been measured before, so their desire could not be gratified. The doctor believes he has found one that will meet requirements in order of the city hospitals, but in postponing the operation a week in order to get the possible fit from among his applicants.

## After Cooper Medical College Land

San Francisco, Nov. 9.—George E. Saner of Denver has arrived here with the intention of instituting suit to recover to real estate in this city claimed to be valued at nearly \$500,000, and which has been in the name of the late Dr. L. C. Lane and comprises part of the large estate left by the deceased physician. Saner claims that he and four other heirs of the late Dr. E. S. Cooper of Galesburg, Ill., are entitled to this property under the will of the late Dr. Elias Cooper of this city, founder of the Cooper Medical college. According to Saner's statement, Dr. Elias Cooper left to his brother, Dr. E. S. Cooper, of Galesburg, certain parcels of land in this city which the latter never conveyed to any one. Saner is a grandson of the eastern Dr. Cooper and is one of five direct heirs.
