Big Mill Combine to Send Up Lumber Prices January 1.

Known as TRYING TO HAVE A HOT.

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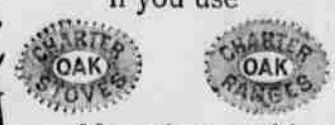
