The President, answering General Fitz John Porter's application for a reconsideration of the centence of the court-martial being executed, has issued a proclamation which removes the only legal obstacle to congressional action, and goes to the limit of his power in the matter. The proclamation, after reciting the well-known facts of the court martial and its results, proceeds:

Whereas, Douois have since arisen concerning the guilt of said Fitz-John Porter of the offence whereof he was convicted by raid court-martial founded upon the result of the investigation ordered on the 12th of April, 1878, by the President of the United States, which are deemed by me to be of safficient gravity to warrant the remission of that part of said sentence which has not been completely executed.

Now, therefore, knew ye that I, Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States, by virtue of the power vested in me by the Constitution of the United States, in consideration of the premises, do hereby grant to said Fitz John Porter full remission of the hereinbefore mentioned continuing penalty.
