OLD GODIVA-SIOUX SOON TO GET BUSY

New Sampling Mill Built at Silver Starts Up Work Today.

PLUTUS MAKES A SHIPMENT

Beck Tunnel Is Better Than Making Its Operating Expenses—Paying Overdraft.

Eureka, April 26.—The new sampling mill built at Silver City by the Taylor & Branton Co., will go into commission today, so it is learned from David Taylor, who has been at the plant for some time looking after its construction. The sampler will handle fully 20,000 tons monthly, and its daily capacity will be from \$60 to 1,000 tons.

The East Tintic Development company is in operation, and last Wednesday work was again started in the shaft. A station will be cut on the 250 foot level and when finished the shaft will drop down another 100 feet without delay.

The King William is working two shifts at the present time, and about 250 feet more work in this tunnel should bring the workings almost to a point where the Plutus recently opened up a nice body of ore. WILL LIST STOCK.

At the meeting of the McKinley Mining company the proposition to increase the capitalization was not voted upon. The officers submitted their reports and showed the company to be in splendid condition. The stock of the McKinley company will be listed upon the New York Stock Exchange next week.

The stock of the McElroy Mining company which has been doing nothing for years will get busy again upon ground adjoining the Plutus and Godiva. The company is the Godiva-Soux-Mountain Mining company. The directors held a meeting the other day and decided to dispose of enough stock to carry on development. Upon the Snugger, one of the best tunnels, and about 250

HIGH IN COPPER.

Mr. Bullock brought in samples of the ore to have them assayed.

They are very high in copper values and also carry some silver and lead.

The railroad vein is believed to be but a few feet beyond the present face of the west drift. Should the stringer be a fair indication, there is no reason to believe that the Bullock property will develop an excellent grade of ore.

This is one of the most eastern properties in the district and will do much toward proving up that the territory is more valuable than is now believed.

The shaft of the Tintic Empire is now down 40 feet and the excavation work has been performed for the installation of the 25 horse power hoist that is to be used. As soon as this is installed some steady development work will be in progress that should result within the next 30 or 40 days.

At the Combination Fraction things are being shaped up for further development work in the shaft.
