

EDUCATIONAL.

UNIVERSITY OF UTAH.

Mr. McManis read a carefully prepared paper on "The Vertical System of Penmanship" before the principals at their session Wednesday afternoon. BIGHAM YOUNG UNIVERSITY.

Provo—After one semester's work in domestic science, the girls find themselves unprepared to take higher courses in cooking without a more extended knowledge of chemistry. A special class has therefore been organized by Prof. May, to meet the exigency.
