The horse-chestnut has been employed in France and Switzerland for bleaching yarn, and is said to hav great power in whitening silk, wool, flax and hemp. The astringent juice is abstracted by peeling the chestnuts, and then grinding or rasping them; they are then mixed with hot rain or running water, in the proportion of twenty nuts to ten or twelve quarts of water.
