

Stamp Collectors Taking Interest in New Varieties

INCREASING interest is taken by American collectors in the stamp issues of the canal Zone, Porto Rico, the Philippines, and Cuba, and it has had a decided influence on the stamp values.

Among these are the stamps of Puerto Principe. Chief of these rarities is the orange brown stamp surcharged "3 cents" on a Cuban stamp of the denomination of 3 millesimas.

The new quotation on the used 3 millesima orange brown stamp of the same issue, with the "3 cents" surcharge, but with the letters on the surcharge upside down, is \$75.

Of the Puerto Principe blue green stamps with the black surcharge very few were quoted in the 1908 catalogue, but the 1909 issue will show many new prices.

Many errors were made in printing the Canal Zone stamps, all of which are prized by the collectors. The value of the 5-cent blue, with the inscription spelled "Panama" is placed at \$20 in the new catalogue.

The changes that have been made in the value of the Philippine stamps are marked. The one real slate blue stamp of 1854, showing the misspelled word "Corros," is now recorded with a value of \$80 unused and \$75 used.

Another error stamp, the 8-cent on the 10-cent, with the inscription, "Corros," is now quoted at \$15 unused and \$3 used.

This Chinese stamps show quite a number of substantial increases. The unused 3-cent red stamp of the 1877 issue, with 46 surcharges in black, advanced from \$25 to \$40.
