Stamp Collectors Taking Interest in New Varieties

NCREASING interest is taken by American collectors in the stamp issues of the canal Zone, Porto Rico, the Philippines, and Cuba, and It has had a decided influence on the stamp values. Many new prices of the surcharged Cuban stamps will be placed in the 1909 catalogue for the first time.

Among these are the stamps of Puerto Principe. Chief of these rarities is the orange brown stamp surcharged "3 cents" on a Cuban stamp of the denomination of 3 milesimas. This stamp has been erroneously quoted by the foreign catalogues at from \$15 to \$30, although a specimen sold for \$87 last winter in this city, and it is now catalogued at \$100.

The new quotation on the used 3 milesimas orange brown stamp of the same issue, with the "3 cents" surcharge, but with the letters on the surcharge upside down, is \$75. The 5-cent surcharge on the unused 1 milesima orange brown stamp is now quoted at \$75, and the used 5-cent surcharge on the 3 milesimas orange brown stamp is also placed at \$75.

Of the Puerto Principe blue green stamps with the black surcharge very few were quoted in the 1908 catalogue, but the 1909 issue will show many new prices. Among these the used 5-cent surcharge on the 2 milesimas blue green stamp is quoted at \$65, and the 5-cent on 4 milesimas blue green stamp at \$100. The unused 3-cent surcharge on the 1 milesima blue green stamp is quoted at \$30; the 3-cent on 2 milesimas

quoted at \$30; the 3-cent on 2 milesimas blue green at \$40, and the same stamp showing the misspelled surcharge "cents" for "cents" at \$60.

Many errors were made in printing the Canal Zone stamps, all of which are prized by the collectors. The value of the 5-cent blue, with the inscription spelled "Panaam" is placed at \$20 in the new catalogue. Another stamp of the same kind, but with the final "A" raised, is quoted at \$25, and a third with a bar at the bottom at \$25. bar at the bottom at \$25.

One great attraction to the collector of the surcharged Cuban and Canal Zone stamp is their very recent issue. Careful watch of correspondence often enables a collector nowaways to pick

enables a collector nowaways to plok up a rare specimen of these makeshift stamps for little or nothing.

The changes that have been made in the value of the Philippine stamps are marked. The one real slate blue stamp of 1854, showing the misspelled word "Copyrat" is now recorded with a word "Corros," is now recorded with a value of \$80 unused and \$75 used. The 5-cent pale vermillion stamp of 1855 is quoted at \$65 unusued and \$27.50 used, which is a complete reversal of former

Another error stamp, the 8-cent on the 100 milesimas carmine stamp of 1879, with the inscription, "Coreros," is now quoted at \$15 unused and \$3 used. The Philippines stamps of the 1881-8 issue, with the surcharges inverted, are now quoted. The 20-cent on 8-cent brown inverted surcharge stamp is quoted at \$10 in either used or unused condition, the 2-cent on 24 8-cent ultramarine inverted surcharge stamp at \$20, and the 10-cent on 2-cent corruins in and the 10-cent on 2-cent carmine inverted at \$12.50 unused.

The Chinese stamps show quite a number of substantial increases. The unused 3-cent red stamp of the 1877 issue, with \$5 surcharged in black, advanced from \$25 to \$40. Of the Chinese 1873-5 issue the 16-cent green stamp surcharged "3 Cand" (candareens) is now placed in the catalogue at \$75 when

The 8-cent gray blue stamp sur-charged "1 Cand" is also quoted at \$60 in either condition. The catalogue puts the value of the Chinese 12-cent light brown stamp, with "1 Cand" surcharge of the 1877 issue, at \$75 unused and \$65 when used. A variety of the Chinese recent issue of 1893, 5 cents in denomi-nation, blue and black in color, with the black inscription inverted, when unused is now valued at \$30.—Washing-
