They claim that Noah and his sons preached and practiced this doctrin or more than 100 years, and were afterwards commanded to multiply. They claim Enoch lived by the same law, by which he was redeemed. They are now preparing to colonize some part of the land of Missourl, and intend to buy lands and possess them according to the laws of consecration or equality, receiving their inheritances by casting lots.
