In 1768 Christopher Sauer, or Sower, at Germantown, Pennsylvania, published the first German edition of the Bible. It was three years in press. After independence had been declared, however, such was the scarcity of Bibles that Dr. Allison, paster of the First Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia, and others, memorialized Congress on the subject, and that body, in 1777, appointed a committee to confer with printers, with the view of having published 30,000 copies at the expense of Congress to be reimbursed by the sale of the books.
