THE LAST WILL OF JOHN C. RIVES .- The late John C. Rives, the publisher of the famous Congressional Globe in Washington, left a will which excites considerable interest, on account of containing some apparently very excentric features. It is dated April 4th (a few days before his death). The Congressional Globe printing office, with all the appurtenances excepting bound volumes of the Globe and the stereotype plates of the work, is left to Franklin and Jefferson Rives, his second and third sons; and the rest of the estate, consisting of money, property in this city, lands in Prince George's county, Maryland, and \$50,000 in Missouri State bonds, to to the other five children. It is provided that the family mansion and lands (50 acres), in Prince George's county, Md., shall not be sold out of the family. Any one of the heirs may purchase the rights of others; but when it happens that a blood relation of the deceased ne longer resides upon the place, then the house and land is to revert to the Government then having dominion over them. The will provides for the gradual emancipation of all slaves belonging to the estate. It ends by years old, no brands visible. expressing the desire of the deceased that the remains of himself and wife be placed in marble coffins and interred in a fire-proof vault, in the Congressional Cemetery, where the stereotype plates of the Congressional Globe are also to be deposited.
