

TELEGRAPHIC. MINERS STONE TRAINMAN. An Engineer Instantly Killed and a Brakeman Hurt.

BRAZIL, June 6.—This afternoon a crowd of angry miners blocked a Brazilian westbound freight train and of late stoned the trainmen. The engineer, William Barr, was struck on the head by a heavy stone and instantly killed. Brakeman A. J. Johnson was hit on the back and slightly hurt. The strikers continued robbing trains and shooting at men in the coalmines where wages were broken.

The movement is intense. Officers and agents and injured trainmen are in terrible shape.

CHINA AND JAPAN.

THE OCEAN APPEARED WITH THE BLACK

HAN FRANCISCO, June 6.—The shark plague in China has been so bad that it is impossible to navigate enough for navigation by large and river craft. Thirty blocks are used water, and a rise of a few feet will inundate the entire town under water.

UNION PACIFIC AFFAIRS.

COMMUNICATION FROM SUBMITTED TO
CONGRESS.

NEW YORK, June 6.—A. H. Hammons, president of the Union Pacific and Southern lines, and an active member of the reorganization committee, will leave for Europe this evening. He expects to be back in New York on June 15. He has been invited to go to Europe to represent the interests of the railroad in the international conference of Mr. V. M. C. A. and George Westinghouse, as well as John W. Atkinson president of the Southern. Mr. Hammons will be present at the meeting of the Pacific Coast Association of Engineers and Architects, to be held in San Francisco, June 10.

"Second, the entire road to the United States in the existing form, including the right of way, the reconstruction of the existing first mortgage bonds, and the balance of the underlying first mortgage bonds, which amount is about \$30,000,000, to be tendered or renewed at a rate of interest not exceeding 5 percent, a sinking fund of \$1,000,000 for interest and sinking

commissions, and the payment of the expenses of the reorganization of the roads.

"Third, the railroad to be provided for a settlement of the claims of the United States substantially upon these terms has been drafted by the attorney general of the United States and has been submitted by him to Congress.
