FOREIGN.

HAVANA, 16.—The insurgents attacked a convoy for San Antonio, from Puerto Principe, and killed and wounded four officers and seventy-seven men.

CONSTANTINOPLE, 16.—The Levant Times has been suspended again, for publishing a calumnious statement in relation to a dignitary.

KISSINGEN, 16.—One of the wounds received by Bismarck in the wrist is nearly healed; another, caused by the burning of the flesh, is still painful, but the inflammation is slowly subsiding. Kullmann has been removed from Kissingen to Weezburg.

LONDON, 16.—Albert Grant, a Liberal Conservative, member of the House of Commons for Kidderminster, has been unseated for corrupt practices in his electoral canvass.

It is said that the Brussels Congress on International Law, after a formal opening and organization, will appoint committees and suspend general sittings.

The governments of Austria and Russia have agreed to open negotiations with the Sublime Porte, looking to the recognition of the independence of Roumania by Turkey.

The Admiralty court has awarded the owners of the steamer *Spray* \$77,000, and Barry and Auburn \$25,000 salvage, for towing into port the abandoned French steamer *Amerique*.

The Gabriel timber wharf at Rotherhithe, covering a quarter of an acre, was burned last night; thirty-five gallons of creosote on the premises were burned. The loss is not yet stated, but it must be very heavy. Three persons were injured during the fire.

MADRID, 16.—The Carlists abandoned the siege of Pucerta after a second assault, in which they were repulsed. The Carlists besieging Cuentá have occupied the houses in the suburbs of the city. Reinforcements for the besieged Republicans have arrived from Madrid, and the city is being energetically defended.

LONDON, 17.—A despatch from Lauraine, Switzerland, announces the death of the Rev. Mr. Goodrich, grand son of Noah Webster.

Scotland won the Elchoshield at the Wimbledon meeting, England second, Ireland third.

In the House of Lords this p. m., Earl Carnarvon, secretary for the colonial department, stated that Her Majesty's government was ready to accept the cession of the Fiji islands, if made unconditionally, but the conditions proposed by Fiji were not acceptable. The Governor of New South Wales has been instructed to submit the views of the government on the matter to the king and inhabitants of the Fiji islands.

The licensing bill passed the House of Lords last night.

The Times correspondent at Santander telegraphs that the probability of foreign intervention in Spain is much discussed there.

A special telegram to the *Daily News*, from Vienna, says the journals of that city suggest that the European powers, collectively, urge France to prohibit all French support of the Carlists who cross the French frontiers, on account of the barbarities practised by their forces.

Dispatches from India announce that the inundations are subsiding.

Thirty-five thousand gallons of creosote were destroyed by the fire at Rotherhithe yesterday.

PARIS, 17.—Madrid journals state that the Carlists have seized a number of men, women and children on the Cantabrian coast, and in Biscay, numbering in all 1600 persons, and hold them as hostages, to be shot in case of an attack by the republicans.

De Fourton, Minister of the Interior, has resigned, and President MacMahon has accepted his resignation. It is said that in consequence of the refusal of the Minister of the Interior to authorize the prosecution of M. Rouher, the Duke de Cases threatened to resign if Fourton remained in the cabinet. Another cause which led to the resignation was that M. Fourton differs from his colleagues in regard to the policy determined on by them of constituting a definite government until the expiration of MacMahon's term.

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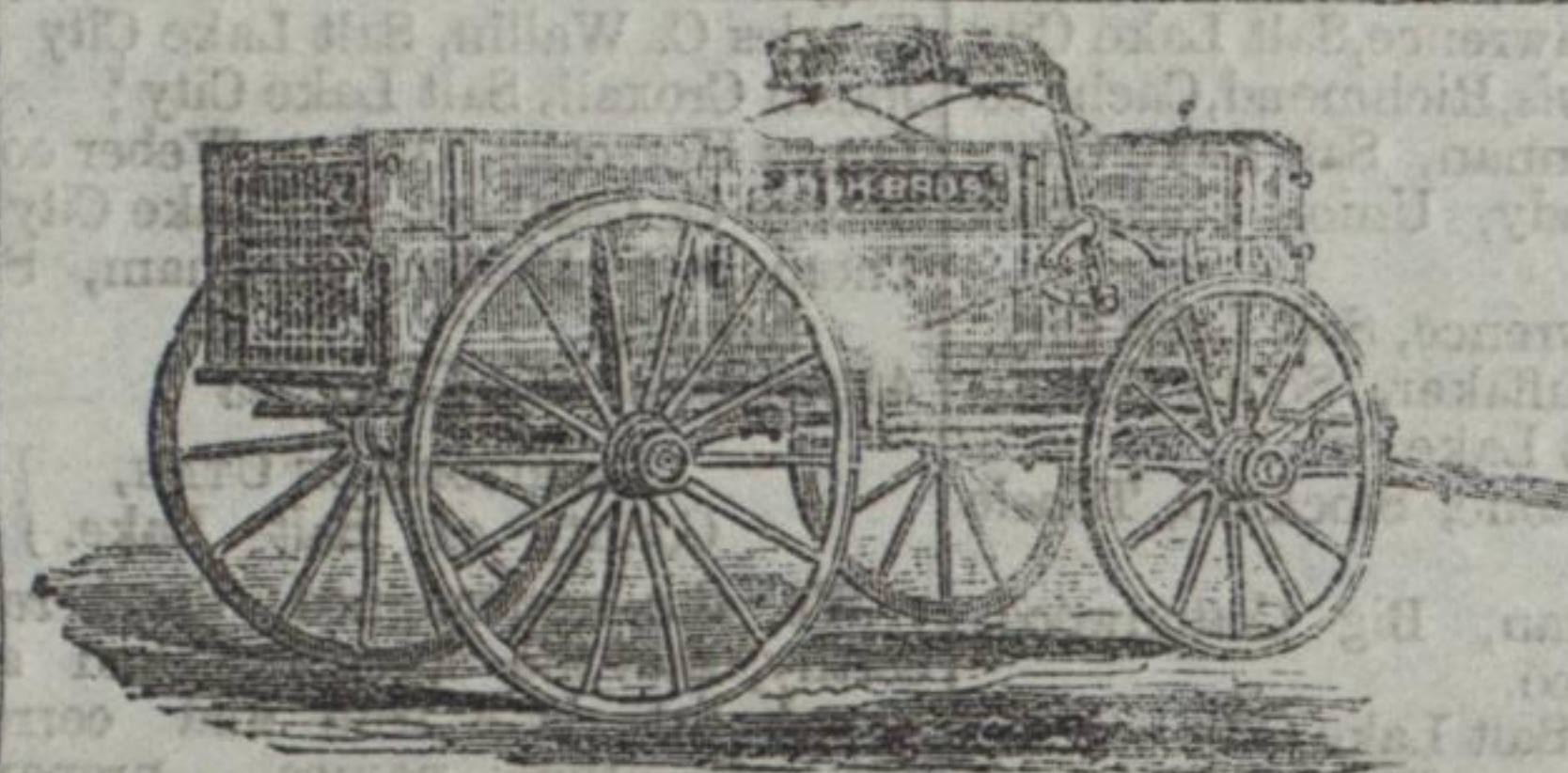

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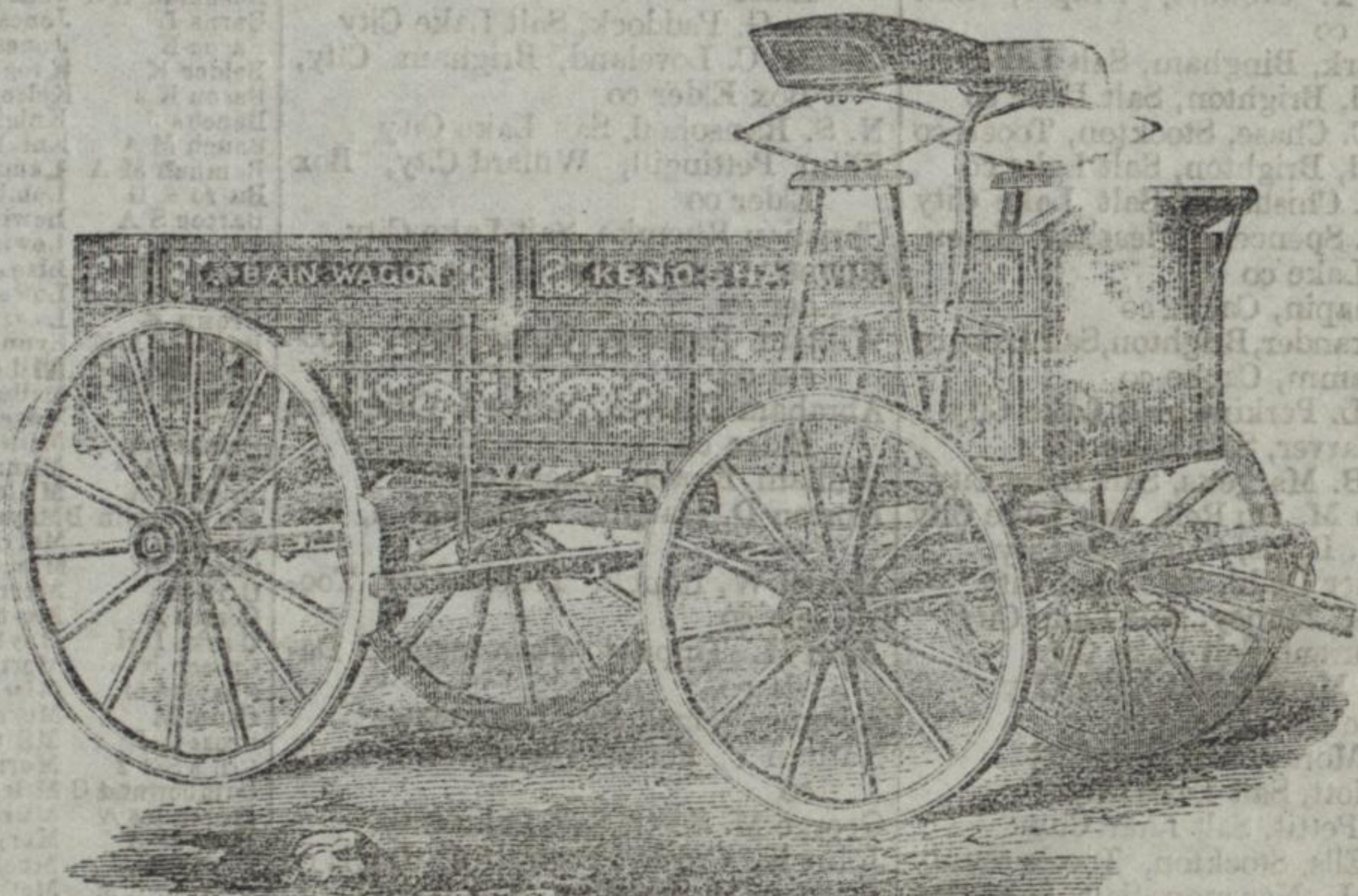
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
