Editor Desert News

It was with mutual satisfaction that we found on the 18th of April that we were appointed to Washington for the North-West Conference, and after spending a week in London, visiting relatives and friends, we proceeded to our field of labor. We arrived on the 21st of April, meeting with President Grant, who appointed us to our respective districts. We have been traveling together most of the time, and during the two months that has passed away, have held forty-four meetings, and have seen that all have been in the operation.

We have discarded most of the plans of the Elders have been preaching for years past, finding that little people were gospel-hardened, taking no notice whether we were of the Latter-day Saints or of the denomination. And we find in some of our new places that the gospel has not been preached there for twenty years. We are laboring with the Lord, arguing up and down, knowing nothing about the Latter-day Saints, only what they have been told by preachers of other denominations, and are traditioned in many places to believe that we discard many of the sacred writings, and some have been led to believe that we are devoid of the Holy Spirit, our Redeemer. However, we have by the help of God, removed these false notions from the minds of the people who have gathered together to hear us dilate on the principles of divine truth, principles that have been revealed to the world, and for the purpose of saving them as exalted them in the kingdom of God.

different places where we held open-air meetings, and it was becoming a rule to visit each place once in two weeks. We have had very good attendance, and the people have followed us through our courses with Bible in hand, pen and paper, making notes of our sermons and proofs. And some of the people have taken to the Bible and preach from agree with theirs in every particular. We have also met with some opposition, in one place some prejudiced persons operating in the name of the church, and about 50 of them kept up an incessant howl during the time we were preaching, and one of the boys, a lad about 15 years of age, threw stones at us, and threw his tridger. After meeting, they surrounded us for about half a mile in several of their street songs.

At another place we were accused by the people of being desirous to know if we was our intention of introducing doctrines which were calculated to destroy the peace of the church. We told them that it was our duty to preach the gospel of salvation to all mankind, and we had come to awaken his neighborhood out of the lethargy they had fallen into, and to warn them of impending danger, and invite them to the true fold of Christ. He raved, and told the people that our doctrine was damnable heresies, and that

they would sink all those who followed them down to hell. We offered to reason the matter with him from the Bible which he professes to believe in, but he would not. We therefore showed the people that their Baptist preacher had accused the Lord of being the author of damnable heresies, as we proved the satisfaction of the people that taught nothing for doctrine or what had been commanded by Jesus and himself.

One instance I will cite, to show the absurd questions we sometimes have to deal with. A religious bigoted to know at the close of one of our meetings where in the Bible the name of Joseph Smith was to be found, he told him it was not recorded anywhere in the Bible. Neither were the names of many of the prophets of old, or any of the apostles of our Savior mentioned before their day. He tried to raise a mob, but the people were for us, and they hooted him off the green, with a shout of "Come, come, come," saying they had never heard the gospel of Jesus Christ explained before, and they desired to be further instructed therein.

There is a religious sect who

over the band, who call themselves "The Salvation Army." They pass the streets with flags flying, singing their songs, followed usually by large numbers of people. The principle they introduce for religion is very easy, any sinner who goes up to the stool of repentance is saved by one of the brethren, and then he is saved. Their preach no doctrines, only "believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, confess you are a sinner, and you are saved, and all those who do not join the church go to hell." We have come in contact with some of the members in a great state of excitement to us they are saved, washed clean by the blood of the Lamb.

hidden in the neighborhood where many of the above sect live we have showed in our teaching who are washed clean in the blood of Christ Jesus. In the epistle, "If we walk in the light, He is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Christ Jesus, His Son, cleanseth us from all unrighteousness." We have said unto the people the necessity of serving all the commandments laid down by our Lord Jesus Christ. We have having much joy in labor and felt determined to go ahead, having faith that our heavenly Father will bless us with a successful issue, and that He will fill the duties devolving upon us from day to day, and to overcome all the powers of the adversary that may be brought to bear against us. We have been the cause of conversion and rid our skirts of the blot of this generation, that when we come home we may do so honorably and with a full and complete quota of our brethren and sisters. A. Our faith is that ere long we shall reap a bountiful harvest from

Ministry Labor in the South.
 VIERNON, Ala., July 1st, 1881.
Editor Decatur News:
 Dear Brother—Just six months
 since I wrote you last, and to
 year since I set sail, Lake City.
 Since last writing we have done a
 considerable preaching in new sections
 organized a Branch of the Church
 made many friends and some con-
 verts, but have baptized none as yet.
 We have also met with some severe
 persecution. This is fastened
 prejudices, prejudice is caused
 by ignorance, bigotedness and
 trashy literature, written

persons of the worst stripe, for the purpose of deceiving the ignorant. We have more faith in such gar-brothers than they do in their Bibles; but we have more faith in the light of nature, to light, knowledge to knowledge, virtue to virtue, and truth to truth, or reason to reason.

There are hundreds of honest people in the South who are not to blame for their prejudices, for it is from infancy, and they have never heard the first good thing about Utah. We continually find people who firmly believe that if a man goes to Utah he cannot get away; that he will be a slave, and a more miserable than ever lived upon the earth. We are often asked which direction Utah is; if it is across the ocean, if it is in the North, or in the South, or of our own, if we don't have a different Bible, we don't worship God, or if we don't have a different set of members to go to Utah, if we don't compel a man to have seven wives, if Brigham Young didn't have a thousand questions. So much for ignorance.

There is much in the way of

people are greatly disappointed. They expect to hear us tell a great miracle about marriage and married life, but instead of this we tell them of the great things that God has done to them faith, repentance, baptism, the Holy Ghost and the kingdom of God. As soon as members are gathered they gather in groups to discuss the merits and demerits of the discourse. ("Can't preach," "Never heard as much before," "Never heard as much Scripture used in all my days," "He preached out of our Bible," "Never seen the Bible so explained," "I consider him a small man; he understands his business;" and many such expressions are often heard.) The people give great praise to the instigator of God. There are generally a great number of faithful, who consider himself a hypocrite, and confess to be a Christian, and possibly the father of a dozen half breed negroes by different black women come forward to question the preacher, and to ask many things, and are chagrined at the exposure of his ignorance, and the laughing of the crowd. After the preacher has said a few things, he usually goes as easily as possible, and the preacher receives invitations to visit different families and to preach again. Every body goes well, and everybody is glad; but alas! the devil takes the good seed out of many hearts; he sows tares, and they spring up and choke out the wheat; he sows on stony ground, and it hardens and keeps the wheat on good ground from being destroyed also. A mob is raised, and the preacher in order to be safe, is obliged to serpentine his way, harmless as a dove," has to move away. Such is missionary life.

There are many minds inquiring about the doctrines of the church, and learn of our doctrines, but they dare not invite us to their homes, or attend our meetings. Some believers are afraid to go to our meetings, more than that, Brother Dale, a member of the Church, dare not ask us into his house under the penalty of being cut off, and some of them, even with his little ones, and that by his own brother! Is there any wonder that people are somewhat timid in asking us to go and to preach under these circumstances?

But the more we become known

The more does prejudice decrease there are, several people here who have been in Utah and their influence aids us greatly in promulgating the truth. We had a long conversation with Mr. Coleman of Aberdeen, who, by the way is a Baptist and the Superintendent of a Sunday School in that place and who visited Utah on business about a year ago. He spoke in halves of the "Mormons" and the Saints generally, and said he was convinced of one thing while in Utah, viz: that the "Mormons" are a Christian people and should be let alone.

Many copies of the *Courier-Journal* are taken in this country. It has been the only thing in fighting the "Mormonism." The English Baptist preacher said this morning that if the editor wished to hurt the "Mormons" he should send the *Standard* people would be more apt to believe him.

Elders Robertson and Wilcox are in good spirits and doing a good work in these parts. They have been to come visitor and a good missionary if the Saints would send their papers after reading them, to some of these men or friend among the Saints they would be more good than they might think. I am glad to say some do this.
