PIOCHE NOTES.

From the Record of Aug. 1—
About six miles from Pioche, on the road to Meadow Valley, a good stream of water has been struck at a depth of twenty feet, in a well being sunk by direction of Eliza Lawson.

The number of women beaters in this town is a disgrace to the community. Within the last few weeks there have been at least half a dozen cases before the Justice's Court, besides, we are morally certain, a great number, which, on ac-

count of fear on the part of the women, or some other cause, have not come before the Court, like the one we are about to mention. About four o'clock on Wednesday morning a man went into a house of ill-fame and made an assault on a sick woman. After beating and abusing her, he rifled her dress pockets and obtained what money there was in them. He then fired off a pistol in the house, the ball passing through a table. How many more such cases exist we know not, but certain it is that the heaviest punishment the law can inflict is not too severe for such persons. It is time they were taught that the law will defend the weak against the strong.

EASTERN NOTES.

A Philadelphia correspondent of the New York Herald says: "The Centennial Hotel, about which much has been said and written, is not a certainty, although the enterprise would prove a paying one. It was the intention of the late James Fisk, Jr., to have taken a step in this direction, but his plans never matured." No, James is dead, and his plans found it difficult to mature themselves.

M. Shakosch will bring with him to the United States, Mmes. Nilsson, Torriani, Maresi, Louisa Cary, Messrs. Campanini, Capoul, Bonfratelli, Maurel, Del Puerto, and Manetti. Signor Muzio, Verdi's favorite pupil, will have the artistic management of the season. Verdi's "Aida" and Wagner's "Lohengrin" will be brought out. Messrs. Strakosch and Muzio have quitted Paris for Italy in quest of new attractions.

Walt Whitman is quite ill yet, and is stopping temporarily at Camden, N. J., on his way, when strong enough, to the Long Island or Jersey seashore. His trouble, an obstinate paralysis, the result of former malarial fever, contracted during the war in army hospitals, has been increased recently by depression from the death of his mother, to whom he was unusually attached. It is said he himself has no doubt of recovery, and physicians, though not so sanguine, count on his strong constitution to bring him round. Whitman is now fifty-four years old. He has been sick several months, and is able to go out and around a little. Ex. Nobody wishes Walt any harm, but if his present sickness will only cause him to cease to write his long-legged poetry, the public at large will have good cause to be thankful.


